

# **Community Survey Results**

April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2023

### A. BACKGROUND

In early 2022, Chesapeake Recycles hosted an online petition in the effort to save the city-managed curbside recycling program.

More than 9,000 citizens signed the petition in support of saving the program.

Since that time, our following has grown substantially. Currently, 19,234 citizens have subscribed to our email list, and it continues to grow each day.

## **B. ABOUT THE COMMUNITY SURVEY**

The survey was developed to offer citizens the opportunity to provide insight and feedback about how they recycle currently.

As of the date of this report, 3,203 citizens have participated in the survey.

## C. SIGNIFICANT FINDINGS

- Recycling continues to be a top issue in the city;
- 99% of those responding had used the city-managed curbside recycling program;
- 58% no longer recycle;
- 69% would be willing to pay a fee to reinstate the curbside recycling program.

We hope this report provides City Council Members and City Staff the information needed to make well-informed decisions.

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I would like to see curb-side return and I would be willing to pay a fee.

I have been using the drop off site at Jubilee Park. It seems to me that more instructions & education are needed as the containers see to be mixed up with cross contamination of wrong stuff in wrong Bin.

The price that What is the unit cost per household for recycle. Does it fit in one of #8 above figures. That is what people will have to pay, iit really is not a choice. Either we can afford it or we cannot. Can we just recycle certain items that are most in demand and easily handled.

This should be an included service, and there has to be other places where Chesapeake can save costs. However, since this is such an important topic, I would be willing to pay a fee that takes advantage of the economy of scale for doing the whole city.

I truly believe the recycle program should be reinstate. This is such an easy way to be eco friendly and I really do not understand why the City decided to give up on it to start with. Please reinstate this program.

We may be interested in recycling with the City of Chesapeake, although

the citizens deserve to know if the Cityty will actually send the items to an actual recycling ctr., or we are just going to be charged only to have the items taken to the city landfill. A good perk with the private company that we are currently using is that they accept plastic items 1-8. Perhaps, this survey should have been sent to the citizens of the City prior to ending the service.

I was pleased when the city responded to my request for a second MixedBin at Greenbrier- great in responding to my email quickly and in getting another bin, so thank you for that. I believe in recycling and try to do my part. Would be very happy to have curbside return without a fee.

When a community is set up, this service is one service that is included from our taxes paid.

Get better at managing our tax dollars in the budget. Google, "what is a risk budget."

The same amount of material is being collected as before, the difference is chesapeake has to come up with landfi space for it.

I am disappointed that there is no glass recycling and REALLY miss the curbside recycling program.

My husband witnessed a truck dump the contents of a bin designated for plastic and paper recyclables at the SPSA station in Greenbrier. This bin was recognized as the same type of bin positioned near City Hall, which is labeled with directions saying plastic and paper ONLY. This enraged us for several reasons.

First, we have made great efforts to wash and prepare our recyclable refuse. Second, we have made great effort to transport these items to the recycle bins expecting them to be recycled by the City. Third, we don't expect our City government to lie about any of its activities, including the handling of refuse. We expect these items to be recycled NOT destined for the regional dump like the rest of our trash.

As I am a handicapped citizen, although I use the city drop off sites, it is very hard for me to do so. My son who is also my neialso my neighbor, would come over and take my can out for me. I was able to get my recyclibles out to the can by myself.

Rated questions lower because you do not take glass (Q6) and initially you took all plastics. Now it's restricted to '1 & 2""(Q7)/"

I think Chesapeake should bring back curb side recycling.

There are very few people in my neighborhood that do recycle. Which is sad.

Given the high taxes the city already charges and being retired on a fixed income paying more to the city is not within my budget.

Since the recycling program has stopped I have been making it a conscious effort to do better at recycling in my home. I have used the drop off site by the Indian River Library, it is easy to access and didn't have any issues. The area did seem to be clean and well kept from the surrounding neighbors. It was a little confusing at first knowing which bin was for what. It would be nice to have the curb side however I know that not all residents will recycle properly. If the service was not to come back I would like to get new trash bins as a replacement at no extra cost. Currently my trash bins

both brown and blue are damaged. Also I would like if glass was accepted in the recycling drop off locations.

I'd like the city to reinstate the program as getting to a designated site is not effective or efficient. With regards to the fee what is expected? I can't truly state what I would pay until I know what is entailed in the fee. Is it possible to let us know what will be covered at a certain price point as of course with everything else including ever increasing tolls having a lower monthly rate is preferred. What has been the issue with the program that it was discontinued that other cities don't encounter? If we could get relief on the tolls as a Chesapeake resident traveling within Chesapeake maybe that could go towards the recycling program.

Please bring back curbside recycling!! We used this service faithfully and appreciated the convenience. We're more than willing to pay a monthly fee to have this service reinstated. The thought of plastic recyclables going to the landfill is disturbing.

Not having recycling is irresponsible and shameful.

Please bring recycling back. It is an inconvenience to have to drive to the city site every couple of days. Some of my neighbors just put everything in the regular trash with no regard for the future of our ocean and planet.

I recently moved to Virginia Beach, but prior to that I lived in Chesapeake since 1985. I always found the Chesapeake curbside recycling program to be excellent. I realize that the service downturn led to the decision to discontinue the program, but much of that was outside the control of the contractor. Between China's decision to stop accepting those materials and the pandemic affecting the workforce, the industry bottomed out through no fault of the contractor. Curbside recycling should absolutely be reinstated in Chesapeake. I recycle in Virginia Beach through its curbside

program, and it works very well. I encourage the City to bring back this program. Thank you and best regards.

Need to be able to recycle glass

We already pay astronomically high city taxes. The least the city can do is bring this service back. Its a small amenity that they can provide for all the money they take from us.

This should hands-down be brought back, especially considering the high taxes we pay to live here in Chesapeake.

Thoughts... I'm willing to pay for recycling, but.. what happens when people do not recycle properly? Does this fee cover extra work going through materials? Does the whole load get dumped if there's something that is not recyclable? What does the fee cover? Honestly, we'd be willing to pay higher if we could recycle more. Like glass! There is so much glass being thrown away. I'd pay more if we're actually recycling materials and they're not ending up in the landfill because then it is absolutely pointless to pay extra for it turning into garbage. I hope this works out, but for our family, we visit our library weekly, so it is not too inconvenient. Much peace, love, and support in figuring out a solution. We need to do better for our children and this earth.

I LIKE the drop-off program because: I don't have to store and handle the blue bin, since I am RETIRED, I can save gas by dropping off more manageable loads at least once a week when I go out on other errands. I take soda cans to the animal shelter, but that's a bit of a trip and at 75, I am finding it harder and harder to throw a bag of cans into that TALL wagon. Maybe additional (and smaller) wagons could be placed near a few of the drop-off sites.

I'm sorry about the neighbors on Mann Dr, but many of us, in the last 10 years, have had our peaceful lives forever spoiled by almost 24/7 noise (within 50 ft of my windows), bright lights all night long, crime, and no more wildlife, all caused by the incessant cramming of housing onto every square inch of land. I can't wait to see what effect this tree-less, paved management style will have on our climate.

Instead of redirecting tax funds to what the city clowncil thinks is appropriate, it should be decided by by the taxpayers. They have proven over and over to be bad decision makers.

Decals on vehicles that say In God We Trust should never even have been considered. And ""bonus recruitment money"" for the PD should have been funded by redirecting City Clowncil paychecks, since they don't do nearly enough to warrant a paycheck like that anyway.

The drop off sites are dirty and residents continue to drop off the wrong items, the gates on the enclosure were broken not I after being installed at Russell Library, I take glass to a drop off site in another municipality. The drop off sites have been a colossal waste of tax payer money. PLEASE BRING CURBSIDE RECYCLING BACK

Most people I live near still go through the process of sorting their recycling and putting it on the curb just for it to be taken by the garbage service. I don't even think they know the city ended curbside recycling. so ultimately this is putting a strain on the garbage collection service effectively doubling the trash collection every other week. People will be less inclined to recycle when they have to go out of their way to a drop off site and fill bins that don't really keep up nor are labeled well. Personally I live in the deep creek area and have to cross the drawbridge on 17 to get to the park to do my drop off. Anyone who actually lives in Chesapeake knows that area is a mess most times of the day when the park is open and available for drop

off. I would be willing to pay someone 20 dollars every month to take my recyclables there just to avoid it. so if that's what it takes go for it.

I'd be willing to pay if Battlefield Commons was added to the city route if reinstated. My friends would greatly appreciate this returning as it has become an inconvenience for them to pack up a car and drive across town to drop of recycling once to twice a week since the old container is too big for any regularly sized vehicle.

If curbside recycling starts again, there needs to be a more aggressive form of education to the public so they know what can be recycled and what can't.

I would love to see composting recycling as an option. This would eventually provide garden compost for the city.

A bin for plastic bags at the current recycling locations would be great.

We would really like for curbside recycling to be resumed to save on gas, potential traffic congestion, and to resume a convenience Chesapeake residence have historically had as a service.

I've used this service in my previous address of 2020 Engle Ave, Chespeake, VA 23320. We would have almost full recycle container at least every other week.

Any way the service could be provided again I think it would be a great thing and our family would be grateful to have it back. It is a easy and convenient way for everyone to do their part.

Given the amount of money I pay in city taxes, the service should never incur additional costs to the citizens of Chesapeake. How are all the other cities in Hampton Roads able to maintain this service?

Chesapeake should be a leader in our region of forward thinking and better policies that improve peoples lives including responsible waste management. I still separate my recycling but only dropped it off once.

I went to the meeting and learned of the options to us and the limitations of what is actually recycled.

I think better education about recyclables will greatly impact the standard of recycling. Just a simple print out to put on my bulletin board stating what is actually recyclable. This seems a better solution than trashing the whole program.

The act of recycling has long been touted as an essential measure to mitigate the negative impact of waste on the environment. However, recent findings suggest that recycling might not be the solution we thought it was. In fact, it might even be doing more harm than good in some cases.

One common belief is that washing plastic bottles and containers before recycling them is an eco-friendly practice. However, research shows that washing plastics in hot water generates more CO2 emissions than throwing them in the garbage. Additionally, the recycling industry is becoming increasingly expensive and less profitable, leading to many recyclable materials ending up in landfills.

Despite Greenpeace once championing plastic recycling, they now call it a ""dead-end street."" This is because the majority of the items sent to recycling plants never get recycled. The process of recycling itself is costly, uses a lot of labor, and produces materials that are worth less and less.

While recycling paper and aluminum do save trees and energy, respectively, it's clear that we need to rethink the way we approach recycling. One proposal is to only accept paper and aluminum at recycling drop-off locations, as people often do not understand the rules of recycling, leading to contaminated items and landfill waste.

It's worth noting that not all landfills are environmentally safe. However, the practice of shipping plastic waste to countries like Malaysia only exacerbates the problem. The plastics are stacked high and burned, creating more pollution than if they were in a landfill.

As individuals, we can make a difference by being more mindful of our waste and reducing our reliance on single-use plastics. However, it's essential for governments and industries to rethink their approach to recycling and waste management to address the root of the problem. Only then can we effectively protect the environment for future generations.

We do not recycle nearly as much as when we had curbside recycling. We used to be vigilant about recycling but don't have the time to carry everything to the recycling center or the energy to hold on to recycling and keep it sorted.

Most studies show than less than 20% of plastics are actually recycled or recyclable. This is not an efficient use of our tax dollars.

Why is the drop off not working? If it is because people do not follow the directions, how is that going to change with curbside recycling? I see that the bins at drop off locations contain materials that are not supposed to be in them.

Recycling is a critical component of waste management. PLEASE RE-START CURBSIDE RECYCLING.

Cancelling this service was a big step backwards for Chesapeake, ourselves and most people we know who live here found it to have very negative effect. Would love to see it reinstated,

I very much miss the program. However, I can see why it's not working. The bins are clearly marked and people still put the wrong things in the wrong places. Also, it clearly states no plastic bags. When I dump, I open the plastic bags and put what's supposed to be in the bins and then "recycle " the plastic bags for the next week's run. Three problems I see: 1. I will say in the beginning, all plastics were taken. Now it's just "1 & 2". 2 you asked a question about glass. The sites don't allow glass according to signage. 3. It's very easy to be confused about the cardboard. In the beginning, single use went into plastics, tin, etc. corrugated cardboard in separate. The mixed items bin still states "single use" even though the larger sign states no cardboard at all.

Chesapeake how come the cost of recycling wasn't taken out of what we pay in taxes?

The drop off service causes me to have to put the recyclables in my car and drop them off. Sometimes, the bins have been full and I can't drop off. The drop off locations do not take glass which the city used to pick up. It would be nice if glass and plastic bags were included in recycling. It would also be more convenient for is for the city to do pickup. I would be willing to pay a fee.

I would REALLY, REALLY like the curbside recycling back!! By taking it away, we are just adding more to the landfills and filling them up faster!! Although, I collect and take mine to Deep Creek park about once a week, most the neighborhood puts it ALL in the trash. I see brown and blue cans out at practically every house I pass by. So, what was being recycled is now going to the landfill. Also, I hate to see all our glass products going to the landfills. Did you know you can make sand out of recycled glass to help

replenish our waterways and beaches? What a concept!! Also, if a fee is added, I'd like weekly pickup. I'd also like to see our property taxes go down and the tolls!! What a hefty bill I'm paying!!

I currently take my recycling to the drop off bins, however when I was at the dump to drop off non recyclables (large non bin items) I saw the city dumping the large green bin of mixed recyclables in the dump as well! In the same place I just dumped a broken toilet, I watched as the city garbage truck dumped the recycle bin! I WANT ANSWERS ON THIS! Why is the city dumping our recyclables (what we put in the large green mixed bins at the recycle dump sites) and dumping them in with the trash?? I watched cans, paper, etc pushed by the tractor and mixed with my broken toilet, old mattresses, etc!! This was frustrating. Cancelling the 'Curbside recycling program", was one of the worst decisions the Chesapeake City Council has made since I moved to Chesapeake in 1984. There are on the wrong side of history.

None at this time.

It's more work to recycle as I/we have to use plastic bags, which are provided, and carry them outside.

Of course it is difficult to measure the worth/value of recycling programs. Those citizens that are willing to pay for this service are concerned for the environment and processing/sorting of the recycles is a major pain - especially when the items are, of course, individual when they are used and only mixed together in the big bin. We would prefer to have perhaps 3 smaller bins that are sorted by paper-cardboard, plastic and aluminum/metal. It would remove a lot of the expense and perhaps lead to lower monthly fees - that would be the goal. I worked in the metal recycling business for 22 years and it's a difficult job. When people sign up to pay to recycle, they are also the same people that would consciously make an effort to separate the items as they are disposed of - how much easier to sort at the source than on a conveyor belt or an expensive robotic sorter.

Many hands make light work. Hey, maybe different fees for single bin or multi-bin subscribers!

I already pay taxes for this. Why should I pay more?

I stopped recycling everything except cardboard because I don't want to pay, and also don't want to collect cans, bottles, etc in the garage so all that just goes in the trash. Considering most plastics don't actually get recycled, I'm ok with this. I don't mind collecting cardboard and driving to drop it off (10 minutes away) once a month. Honestly, as far as curbside recycling, I could take it or leave it.

Cost of recycling has gone up. I would have used the other options, but have no where to store my recyclables until I had the time to dispose of them. Not enough drop off sites and conveniences for the citizens to use them. Heated days are coming which attract pest. I hate throwing everything into the bins and going to the landfills, but it is the most convenient option for me at this time.

If the program could also include plastic bags, that would help keep it out of the water ways.

With a busy household, it is very hard to maintain the amount of recycling we did when it was picked up curbside. We recycle now but it is not as much. I can only go once a week, and if it starts stacking up and I can't go then it gets put into the regular trash. Recycling was a part of daily life, and we are taking a step back in Chesapeake by making it much much harder for residents to recycle as they once were.

We would be happy to use the drop off locations if they were picked up more frequently. Whenever we drop off recycled goods, there is mountains of trash around the containers.

We pay enough in taxes. Find some city service that is underused and redirect their funding.

We used a private company for curbside collection from July 2022 - March 2023, but they discontinued service. If there will be extra charges for recycling, please collect them with existing taxes.

One of the reasons I'm not willing to pay a fee is because all of the residents in Shillelagh Farms pay storm water and drainage fees and we get NO SERVICE IN RETURN. You can take those years of paid fees to cover recycle services.

We did not pay a fee before, other cities don't charge especially greedy Virginia Beach. Stop giving the credits to everyone...I have not received anything since loved to my new house but at my previous place I register my can and I could get gift cards and credit vouchers at different places...stop that. I would love dearly to stay in my home and not move.

The City representatives lied when they said that Chesapeake was the only city where citizens were not being charged an extra fee for the recycling program. That is a lie. I have talked to people from Virginia Beach, Norfolk, Hampton, etc. and they assured me that they did not pay extra for recycling, that it was included in the taxes their cities collect.

Chesapeake City council is a backwards group of people that don't care about our environment, Nature and our planet. Shame on them!!!

Reduce, reuse, recycle. This is taught in Chesapeake Public Schools as a state mandated SOL. Yet the schools no longer recycle and recycling by drop off is not feasible for many in our community. Reduce, reuse, recycle is expected of Chesapeake residents and curbside pickup must be offered.

The city discontinued a service paid through my property taxes.

To reduce sorting costs a suggestion would be to provide multiple containers presorting for pickup.

Not being able to recycle has led to a lot of waste and its environmentally irresponsible.

Blue bins were not always used appropriately. I know people in my neighborhood and a previous neighborhood who would use them for trash, which just adds to the cost of a recycling program. For those who actually did ""recycle,"" there was really very little that was accepted, and they were putting a lot of items that were not on the accepted list into their cans, which also adds to the cost of running a recycling program like the one we had. If those things were happening in the two different neighborhoods I've lived in, it's happening all over the city. In our home, we try to be as ""green"" as possible by choosing to buy items with less packaging,

repurposing things like jars and plastic containers, and saving paper for starting campfires. Other people who are serious about recycling will not have a problem taking their items to a drop-off location (especially if the locations are relatively convenient) or paying for a private service. If our recycling materials are actually being recycled, I'd like to see the proof of how, because all the information I've found shows that the majority of recycling programs are just an expensive way to make people feel good but don't actually do much to keep places like Chesapeake green, and I already spend enough of my hard-earned money on taxes and other programs that bear little fruit. For those who want a recycling program using the blue bins, perhaps it can be run through the city, but people could choose whether they want it or not, and if they do, they can pay an additional charge.

Saw a TV news report a while back - City recycling manager said they are only spending 30% of what they did with curbside program - BUT they are recycling only 10% of the amount that curbside program handled. This should be part of our city taxes per household. If you let people opt out of the service, then no one will want to pay the fee.

Money wasted on other projects should fund this program.

I normally drop off recycles at the municipal town hall (near the central library). Originally, there were insufficient containers leading to them being full and I started going down to the drop-off location near the Chesapeake Expressway Toll Office which was a much farther drive but those containers were never full on the handful of trips I made there. Fortunately, more containers were added near City Hall after the initial few weeks and that is a more convenient location and does not require a special trip.

Curb side collection was much more convenient but I heard a lot of what was collected was not recycled. I am not sure if that was true or not. If it was true, has creation of the drop-off sites and separation of cardboard from other ""mixed recycles" combined with the removal of glass recycling, increased the effectiveness of the items actually being recycled?

I would like to see curbside recycling restored to help the environment and future generations, plus cut down on automobile pollution from the individual vehicle trips to the drop-off locations. With curbside recycling, I

generally recycle 33% of my refuse based upon how full my regular trash container was compared weekly to the recycle container picked up biweekly. I still am recycling about 25-30%, due to glass not being recycled anymore. Even once a month curbside pick-up with be appreciated."

However they recently discontinued the service at the price point they started with and quadrupled the price. While I understand the cost of things and traveling around the city made it impossible for them not to raise the price, it made it cost prohibitive for us to do so, so we no longer recycle. Recycling is so

Then decide if the cost is worth it, or are we potentially creating another situation like Richmond experienced? Then educate yourselves on the waste-to-energy facility in Portsmouth. It extracts steel and aluminum from the solid waste stream (read "city trash") and recycles it. And plastics, when mixed with the normal waste stream, have a very high BTU value that contribute to an excellent fuel mix for their boilers, and the emissions can be controlled by their emission control equipment to prevent air pollution. Is this "recycling"? No, not in its purest sense—a new bottle is not being made from an old one. But, if we "recycle" those bottles, do we make new ones anyway. Again, talk to the professionals about what the future of our recycled plastics is. By using the material as fuel you are "reusing" it to produce steam and electrical power. It stays in the municipal waste stream and provides a measurable value to society at a fraction of the cost of a recycling service—curbside OR drop off. When/if the situation changes and recycling becomes a practical, financially viable practice then this policy should be re-evaluated. But, at this time your best option is to keep the plastics, paper, and cardboard in the municipal waste stream. Let the waste-to-energy folks separate the tin and aluminum cans, and the scrappers" take larger metal items to the facilities which handle those. Citizens don't need to pay for a placebo that is practically providing no benefit.

By not having the ability to recycle feels immoral for what our world needs. Recycle sites are not feasible for those of us that have busy lives including work and management of a household of 7. Recycling allows us to teach our future generations how to take care of our planet.

Please bring back the recycling program. A lot of people are not going to take the time to recycle if they have to go to a pa place to drop off their recycling. They'd just throw it in the trash. There's too much stuff being thrown out that could be recycled and it hurts our environment.

Please bring back Chesapeake' city recycling, it breaks my heart of adding to this destruction of power-earth. Furthermore, I was not aware that there was a recycle drop-site.

Let's keep stuff out of the landfills, please.

If any additional monies are needed for recycling it should come from/within our real estate tax payments. Or some other type of tax like the Strom Water taxes collected...

We have lived in Chesapeake since 1972 and have recycled ever since the city started curb side pick up. We really miss it but due to us being senior citizens now recycling at the drop off sites is difficult. We don't recycle at all now and really miss it.

I think recycling is important. I know that many people who used to do it did not do it correctly and that is not good for the environment. If people will follow the instructions, it would be better.

The city drop off sites fill up quickly despite the number of containers. I use the one by the library so that says a lot. I really would like to see glass recycled because I use glass products more than plastic.

We already pay sanitation fees and taxes are going up based on real estate inflation. I feel it should already be included in what we already pay.

I would only want recycling to come back if it done properly. Have residents separate materials at home. I would rather go back to the small bins if needed.

I'm fine without the recycling program.

I am at a loss as to how you can't come up with a reasonable solution to this problem. It would be understandable if all of the surrounding cities were having recycling issues as well, but they aren't. Why can't you model our recycling program around what our neighboring cities are doing?

With the increase in my real-estate tax I feel that should cover the cost of curbside recycling.

Chesapeake is a vibrant community, it reflects poorly upon us that we cannot do something as basic as recycling.

I really don't care how much it would cost to reinstate the recycling program. As a person who is committed to recycling, it pains me to throw out glass. I would prefer not to pay more than \$10 a month but I'd be willing to pay whatever I need to to get it started again. There's no excuse for not having recycling as part of a city budget. Everyone has to do their part to protect the environment at this time.

Plastic recycling isn't viable. I would love to see curbside recycling of paper, cardboard, glass, and aluminum. However, a lot of people would probably assume that you can just throw anything in there just like the old plan.

I now pay a private company to pick up my recycling materials but I do

have to put it in bags tat the company does supply but having the blue can was much easier and I hope it starts again.

We are 80yrs of age. No longer able to use location for recycling near us. Could easily fill a recycle can each week. Still do.. Would pay for recycling if must. Please do this. Must save the planet.

We should have been given the option to pay for curb side collection if we wanted to do so

Very disheartening that the city isn't interested in keeping Chesapeake green

Thank you for your thoughtful consideration on this extremely important issue

Please return to curbside recycling. I reduce my garbage by 85 per cent with curbside recycling.

I am elderly as is 50 % of Chesapeake's population, your figures. It putting extra work and stress on me.

I want to continue to recycle, so Please return curbside recycling to Chesapeake.

I utilize the City drop off site at city hall once a month. Its convenient and accessible. I am not willing to pay a fee for this service that I do for myself for free. I will opt out of having another BIN at my home! I don't think I should be charged anything if I OPT OUT or do not agree to have curbside recycling at my home. I already pay too much in CITY FEES and TAXES. You just spent how much money and wasted how much time on getting rid of Curbside Recycling? Now you want to, pardon the pun, Dig it up again? How outrageous! You got rid of recycling, move onto the next issue.

Stop wasting money on this, almost nothing actually is recycled anyway.

It is vital to our environment to recycle. I do not understand why this service was abandoned by my city, all other cities in Hampton Roads charge a fee per household but Chesapeake decided to discontinue the service instead of letting its citizens shoulder some of the cost. No specific glass recycling receptacles are available at City drop-off site. Council might consider adding glass specific recycling.

Why would I want to pay when you have raised the prices of water and sewage also.

Please reconsider recycling in Chesapeake again. People care. Our family still separates our trash for trash and recycling even though it all goes to the same place.

When we first looked into to Alternative recycling, we thought that it was too expensive. Not to mention the fact that the cost of everything else has risen including food, gas and our utility bills. With our busy schedules we don't have time to drop off recycling either.

As shown in question 8, I am not interested in curbside recycling if it adds another fee to the taxes and fees that we already pay. If there is a fee of any amount then next year it will be increased greatly with no opportunity to drop out.

Knowing that only a very, very small amount of what goes into the recycle bins are actually usable for recycling, the city should not invest money into this project. They even added an extra bin there. I think they should reinstate curbside recycling and make recycling easier for everyone.

The program was a complete waste of taxpayers money with many problems. The market for recycles is not there and the city should not be supporting it. Private vendors can do a much more efficient job. Leaving the

taxpayer the right to decided if they want to participate in the program through a private vendor or use the drop off sites .

Despite many Americans believing that what they carefully sort is recycled and turned into something new, it is often shipped abroad to developing countries without the capacity and infrastructure to efficiently recycle waste. Despite this, these waste exports are counted as "recycled" by official figures

Feel citizens need better instruction on what can and cannot be included (difference in a cereal box vs packing box) etc to make sure things are properly sorted and if we go back to pickup clarifying what can be included (no greasy pizza box, rinse out pasta sauce jar etc) to make sure you receive the right materials to keep this working for everyone.

I feel that we should not have to pay for recycling. Especially since we pay so much in taxes.

Hoping we can continue to protect the environment and its habitats!

Bring back curbside recycling!

Wouldn't it be more efficient for people to separate their recycling for pickup and trucks to pick it up and keep it separated on the truck?

I think people who care about recycling also want to know that it actually gets recycled and doesn't end up in the landfill because of contamination."

I already pay taxes. Why would I agree to pay an additional fee? In my opinion the reason we don't have recycling now is that the program was mismanaged. It is just sad.

I am willing to pay a fee that is reasonable to the city and its citizens for curbside recycling as I do not have the means to recycle on my own. Meaning, getting the material to a recycling site. Also, private recycling services are not worth it. They only offer a 13 gallon bag of recycling which doesn't fit most recycling materials."

I did not realize how much we were able to recycle until the service was stopped by the City. The amount of trash our household produces has more than tripled. We are unable to bring recyclables to drop off areas. My husband (firefighter) and I (RN) both work long shifts and it makes it difficult to get things like that done. In 2023, is irresponsible of a modern-day city to not assist their residents with recycling. Chesapeake, please bring back curb side recycling!

I believe that if you want to recycle then there are plenty of drop off locations.

The bad thing about recycling is that about 90 % of everything is suitable to recycle and just goes in trash anyway. "

Since Chesapeake is the only city in HR that doesnt charge for trash removal, perhaps the city should just charge a flat fee for trash and include recycling. This way residents cannot complain they don't want to pay for recycling if they dont support recycling. I honestly wouldn't charge more than \$10/mo for the combined removal. With increases in all city taxes lately, going over 10/mo wouldn't go over well. With approximately 90,000 households in Chesapeake, at 10/mo, and assuming 60% are single family homes, the city could generate over \$500,000 per month plus fees for multi-family structures. This should cover 5-6 additional trucks for recycling. Fact is people who want to recycle WILL recycle, the key is convincing people it is a good idea. Municipalities haven't done a good job at doing this.

Recycling is a waste of time. China does not buy those materials any longer.

You would do us a better service allowing yard waste grass, branches etc to be collected in the blue bins rather than clear bags which are so difficult to handle and lift as a senior citizen. Those I think the city still can mulch.

I do not have many items that ever qualified for your old blue bin recycle categories.

Whatever you do DO NOT increase my costs. PLEASE

I am unsure if recycling is an economically viable option for the city. Where would the materials be taken, what percentage is actually recycled, and unless that information is satisfactory I am unwilling to pay for a service that will send the majority to the landfill anyway.

I attempted to use a drop off site 3 times and each time the bibs were full and it was difficult. I ended up paying for recycling and it sucks. I hate using plastic bags for my recycling and miss my bin.

The amount of garbage my neighbors put out is ridiculous. it's bad.

We used a private recycling company in the summer and fall of 2022. We decided to cancel our service with them because they did not provide bins (we had to supply our own bags), they did not collect all recyclables and the service cost over \$30 per month.

We pay enough taxes and the program ran properly should be self sustaining.

I'm not willing to pay a fee. I will not recycle if its forced upon the citizens.

People who recycle should just pay for a private service.

Why would we be paying a free? The money used for recycling was redistributed to the general sanitation program since there was increased need. If the city goes back to recycling, then one could assume the sanitation financial needs would decrease and therefore shifted back to recycling.

We already pay enough in taxes to cover this service. The recent years of exorbitantly property tax increases seem designed to displace the working class and retirees out of their homes. After paying taxes here for almost forty years there should be some relief for retiring seniors. "

Too much money to recycle and I do not want to start again at home. I vote NO.

Do not reinstate curbside recycling as the percentage of materials collected for recycling are not ultimately recycled. It's a "feel good" service which the funds could be used elsewhere."

I feel we pay enough in taxes to begin with. We keep paying more and more for less and less. Not willing to pay amy extra. Actually getting rid of paying the private company and just throwing it all way because of the prices for everything is just too high.

Please help us keep Chesapeake and the earth clean. So many people are not recycling at all now because it can be difficult to use drop off sites and the posted hours on their website aren't enough.

I was in favor of doing away with program and still feel the same way. Other cities have terminated the program. Only a matter of time.

Chesapeake When the city took recycling away it should have been voted on by the the citizens. The decision should not have been made by just council members. They are not the only ones who live on the city. If the citizens voted it out ok. We had no voice.

As much as this city takes off our backs in taxes for them to not offer recycling is a joke.

Please bring recycling back!!! We just had to change to an alternative private service due to our original choice (Happy Planet) cancelling its service to the area due to price pressures. A city this size should be "all in" on recycling.

I feel that Chesapeake can more than afford to reinstate recycling to help the environment. The reality is that most people will just throw those items in the regular trash without having recycling available. And although the cost of living in Chesapeake has increased significantly since I moved here initially in the 90's, the services provided have not, not to mention the massive removal of natural habitats and wetlands to build more housing

which is obviously providing more revenue meaning Chesapeake can definitely afford to provide recycling for no added cost."

We use Recyclops. We also have them pick up the glass. That is put into a separate container. Their system works pretty well except cardboard. Cardboard has no container so you cannot put it out when it is raining.

All this extra trash can't be good for landfill capacity. We had 1 trash bin and 2 recycling bins. Now it seems like we have 3 trash bins, and most weeks, all three are full.

With the taxes I pay, why should I pay for recycling. There is so much we are supposed to get with our tax revenue that we don't get. They used to do mosquito spraying frequently and now not so much.

Recycling as a global issue is a huge challenge and ditching curb service was a mistake. There are numerous comments about people not recycling correctly and that contaminates the recycling stream. Bring back the curb cans with large, bright, easy to read decals that spell out in very simple terms what can be put in the can. Some cans don't have one and many are too weathered to read (maybe place them on the inside of the lid...?). Additionally, there were some recycling videos on the city website that did not jibe with what was on the cans. So the city needs to do more to demystify what the program will accept in the cans. Bring curbside back!

I think the curbside recycling program is a worthwhile and valuable service to our community.

I am 75 years old and dragging recyclables to the dumpsters is not easy for me. I feel guilty every time I throw a recylable in my garbage. I would love to have recycling back and willing to pay for the service. Why should i pay for a service that my taxes do.

We pay enough in city tax to cover recycling collection especially since many recyclables are sent to the landfill still requiring city collection in regular trash pickup. City of Chesapeake needs to balance the budget the same as other cities within the Hampton Roads area.

We already pay a large amount in property taxes for areas that are not upkept, why would we have to pay for recycling. The city stopped the recycling program because they didn't want to hire more workers to use the outdated trash trucks that required someone to lift the trash into the back of the truck. I am so sad that the recycling program was discontinued. I desperately wish it would be reinstated and accessible for all.

We are certainly willing to pay the city for service and believe it is fair for the city to charge a fee. As an alternative, we are ok with continuing to visit the drop off sites but strongly need an option for glass.

Take the fee out of the exorbitant property taxes I pay. Chesapeake needs to show that increase in money is being used for something. Also while I'm on a roll...stop the insane building of more housing. Show the community the plan for infrastructure and schools before you approve one more housing development.

Last time it was included in our taxes!

I'm not even sure what cardboard means. Is that just heavy cardboard from mailing boxes or thin cardboard from cereal and packaging boxes? This makes up about 25% of our recycling amount, maybe more. I'm so confused and unsure.

I've noticed the city presently picks up all trash (blue and brown cans) at curbside each time they come.

I pay enough taxes. The city can find a way to bring it back.

We drive (approx) 3 miles to drop off at city spot. Drive isn't bad but it's a bit of a hassle-collecting & transporting etc.. We still recycle all eligible materials, because it's important!! We still use our (clean) blue bin to hold items for trip!

Stopping curbside was a BIG mistake by Chesapeake! I get why we can't recycle glass at city sites (breakage, shards all over the site), BUT it was 1 of the first materials ever for recycle. (Past generations returned beverage bottles to stores for deposit, paper bags had multiple home uses. .)

We all need to use recyclable materials when possible (less plastic, less styrofoam!) for the future of our planet, our children (& their children) and all (land & water) wildlife.

Our taxes & utilities go up, yet we lose services that protect the environment! Shame on us for stopping Recycle service in Chesapeake.

This survey is not complete and aims to direct the company back in business rather than seeking a solution. The recycle service only took certain metal cans. I can set all scrap metal on the curb and scrapper metal men will take ALL of it and it costs the city nothing. Secondly, the recycle service only took flat, perfect 8.5x11 paper. It did not recycle all paper or all cardboard. It's a joke, a scam. Keep them out of our pockets and the city's. Encourage private citizenry to do it, just as I do with the scrap metal'ers. They do it on their own for free and live off the residual income from scrap. It works. Find ways to do the same with glass, cardboard, and all paper. Keep in mind, trees (paper) are nature's natural recyclable material.

So many things I read say it is not feasible to through the process of making this reusable. Not cost efficient etc. There is only 1 person in our 35 home development that pays a service to pickup their recyclable materials.

Other communities recycle plastics # 1 -7. I thought these were accepted at first at the drop off sites. Then I noticed only # 1s and 2s were being accepted. Other cities recycle more than only those two so I'm not sure why Chesapeake can handle only 1s and 2s. I believe those who recycle at separate locations or pay for the service are "true" to the cause of recycling.

It is incredible that in this day and age and all we know about the damage we have done to this earth, the decision was made to further pollute it. We need to be reusing every little thing we can especially since advancements have been made to be able to use recycled materials to make new packaging and other items.

We are the only local city with such lacking services. All of our neighboring cities understand the importance of protecting our environmental future, except Chesapeake. It's embarrassing and shameful.

Please bring the recycling back.

It was cancelled although there was a surplus in the budget. If this city wants to attract young, professionals they need to look at their decision making processes. The remaining three neighbors chose to trash their recyclables b/c it was too cumbersome to drive their materials to a drop off spot. As a result between the three houses who do not recycle an additional 5 trash cans are put out on trash days beyond what they put out prior to the cancellation of recycle service.

I would like to see service restored and include glass. Glass is the one recyclable we have accumulated b/c the City decided not to have a drop off for it, for some reason. It seems paper, cardboard, and glass are the three items that would be the easiest to find a company to recycle for reuse.

Let's get us moving forward again and restore curbside recycling. My neighbors have said they would go back to recycling if it was made easy. "

WAS PAYING FOR A PRIVATE SERVICE. THEY COULDN'T CONTINUE AT \$15 A MONTH, WANTED TO INCREASE TO \$100. NOT IT ALL GOES TO THE DUMP. I'M TO OLD AND NOT WILLING TO LOAD MY CAR WITH TRASH AND TAKE IT TO A DROP OFF SITE.

This is an essential city service. Too much recycling is going in the trash!

Need to be able to get glass recycling

If recycling is brought back, I recommend having better education for people, so the correct materials are placed in the containers

Chesapeake. I do not feel safe at the drop off facilities and I feel this should be a service provided by the city at no additional cost to the residents.

My husband and I were married 43 years ago and have been recycling

since the beginning of that. Now everything goes in the garbage and every time I put a recyclable item in the trash. I feel something is very wrong! Please bring back curbside recycling.

Would like to have the option to not pay for the months I am out of town

Would like to be able to have curbside collection it really takes a lot of effort to go to the collection site. I know many of my neighbors don't even waste their time.

I imagine city leaders acknowledge the benefits of recycling. It is not lost on people that recycling is a complex process and that all responsibilty should not be placed on city workers to see that it can be accomplished. Communicate with your constituents how we can assist to improve the process without adding cost through taxes. I think you would be surprised at how well people would respond if you simply learned how to communicate with us effectively.

At a time when we should be doing more to help the environment it feels wrong to do away with curbside recycling. We heard (and saw pictures posted on NextDoor) the city's drop off sites were overflowing and, since we work full-time, we opted for the convenience of Recyclops. It saddens me to see blue bins at the curb and know that none of it is being recycled. We need to think about future generations and the impacts our decisions will have on them.

Sorry, but you didn't listen to the citizens when your bean counters slashed the recycling service. I am perfectly satisfied with the current situation, as all my trash is picked up weekly and, I have a bonus container when I have excessive waste for that week. No separating and making sure no unacceptable items are in the recycle bin. Easy win for me. If you do bring it back I will not pay any additional fee as I feel our excessive property

taxes should cover the cost.

I would participate and pay for the service as long as I know that the recyclable items actually get recycled and help our environment, and not treated like the rest of my trash. I was a consistent recycler because it was a convenient way to help the environment.

I would like the recycling program reinstated.

I am only willing to pay for recycling if the material collected is actually recycled and not disposed of in the general waste stream.

I am not willing to pay extra for recycling because I have read that most "recyclables " are not actually recycled.

Currently- iot minimize trips to drop site I bag everything except cardboard in a clear lawn bag & take it in once ever other week. I don't include my glass and haven't found a place to those items. I empty the bag at the site then reuse the bag - often sticky by now - to gather lawn clippings & debris. It manageable but I'd very much prefer curbside pick. I'm a retired disabled Navy veteran and I have time  $\square$  but if I was still active duty or if I wanted to work, it'd be unlikely that I'd keep up w/ it."

Recycling is a public good and a necessity for the future of our planet. It was irresponsible of the city to eliminate the program. Add a fee to EVERYONE's taxes and reinstate the program. The way it is set up now, only those with a conscious or those who can afford a paid service recycle; it also adds the burden of another errand for working, taxpaying adults.

Please save our planet and our city. So many people today just don't care, however let's make a concerted effort to preserve our planet for future generations!! Thanks

Please ensure that the materials collected are actually recycled!

I like the dropoff location at City Park as it is convenient for me and the amount of recyclables I collect. I do not want curbside service or the dropoff locations if the recyclables are not really being 100% recycled. Going through all the effort to recycle only to have it end up in the trash is not worth it.

We had saved our small blue boxes from years ago and use them to collect our recycling items. When they are full, we take them to our local recycling site at Russell Memorial Library. The only thing not accepted is glass items.

I don't understand how we are not recycling or why there would be an extra fee attached to do so. When I lived everywhere else (Hampton, Newport News, and even Florida) recycling was included with trash. We already pay so much more in taxes since moving here to Chesapeake, but we don't get the same services as in Hampton. This includes the ease of bulk pick up and having a yearly limit. "

We've uses the city recycling locations a few times and they have always been full. Curbside was the best! I'd be willing to pay \$10/m for ir to come back.

We used (my household) both private and city drop-off sites. We paid a lot for both regular and glass recyclables and would pay similar for the city to start up again and to include glass a more plastic types. We believe it is so wasteful to send recyclable materials to our landfills. The landfill near us is an eyesore to our beautiful area and smells horrible. I feel bad for the neighborhoods next to it! Also, more education on reuse of materials is needed for citizens of Chesapeake and the US as a whole. Finally, we need to promote businesses and industries that recycle. Why don't we

have enough of them in the US! Lets get going on recycling and reuse and we need to stop throwing things away that can be reused and stop putting them in landfills!

Please bring recycling back.

My taxes have increased sustantially within the past couple of years and there are new housing developments being approved and popping up everywhere adding to that tax revenue. I honestly don't see where that money is going. Roads are no better, no new schools are being built, and on top of that, no recycling?? The ONLY city within the 7 cities that doesn't? This shouldn't even be up for debate.

I would like to know what you are doing with this stuff and how much is really recycled. That would improve the likelyhlikelihood I would be willing to pay for it.

We are Senior citizens now and on Social Security, so something else to pay isn't possible but we Do like to Recycle.

Options for fees for private service are too high. We pay only \$12/mo.

Recycling is good for the environment. If we want to have a better future we need to recycle & reuse! The landfills are already too full!

Please consider reinstating recycling. Our communities were active when we had curbside and it seems now much of what could be recycled gets thrown away. The drop off site is something some people will do, but even there all items cannot be recycled. We are already an extremely wasteful country, so whatever efforts the city can provide to curb that is very important to the future of this planet.

"My garbage can is heavier / fuller (full of glass and non-recycled materials) now than before. This is an obvious way to both help the environment, reuse base materials and decrease the amount of ""garbage"" going in to the landfill.

Expanding the list of what is recycled and offering it curbside will increase the use of the blue can. Not offering curbside is wasteful.

Bring back curbside recycling

If the things we put in recycling bins (curbside or at a drop off sites) actually get recycled (many rumors that most goes to landfills), then this needs to be communicated to everyone. Dispel the rumors!!

The collection sites don't take glass and this is a problem.

Please bring back the recycling program.

I am following the voting on this issue very closely, and any council member who \*doesn't\* enthusiastically vote to restore recycling will not only lose my vote, but will also be actively blasted on on all social media platforms available to me to ensure I convince as many others as possible to vote the right people into office.

Chesapeake I already pay for waste management.. recycling was included so why should we be charged extra?

Why we are paying tax? If they won't give anything back.

I typically recycle at city view park and over by central library. The cardboard containers are frequently full after the weekends at both locations. If reinstated which i think is beneficial, more marketing on what can and can't be recycled for the public.

We are able to easily utilize the City Park recycling containers but we have noticed most of our neighbors just put it in the trash now. In the past we had also noticed many items sticking out of the recycle bins that were NOT recyclable (pizza boxes, plastic grocery bags, etc.) We were not surprised when the curbside program was halted.

Please bring back recycling

I would be willing to pay for curbside recycling but others won't so they mix it in with their garbage.

May if the cost was very reasonable they would get on board but most who use private companies pay from \$10-\$20 per month.

I thought the reason curbside recycling stopped was much of the recycled material was going to the landfill anyway .... A huge waste of city money

I think that Hampton Roads should start a recycling plant, it creates jobs, and makes Hampton Roads' environmentally responsible, metal can be sold to local companies that buy metal already. As far as plastic goes we should be limiting the waste plastics like the ones that end up in the trash after 1 use and should be using containers that last rather than are easier to dispose of or that are compostable. I know that's a big want but the country has gone crazy with the waste it creates to make life easier. I try doing all I can to eliminate waste going out of our home, and cardboard in the garden to control weeds, it saves some on the cost of mulch and shredded paper into the compost if they compost. Separate containers for plastic and metal pick-up would make it easier to recycle.

Why should I pay as much for trash pick-up as a larger family? The census was taken not that long ago so you know who should pay more for trash pick-up, we are seniors only 2 of us, and do all we can to save on waste, our can doesn't need to go out every week.

People need to be informed about how to be more responsible with waste.

I assume that the City took into account the increased costs of not recycling and having the recyclable materials added to the normal trash stream? Increased tipping fees, fewer homes served with each truck load means more trips to cover the route. Overtime paid to drivers to handle the added volume and trips? I'm sure there are other costs I haven't come up with in the two minutes of thought I've given to this response. None of this happens for free.

Chesapeake, I am appalled that you chose to discontinue the curbside recycling, but at the same time, raised our property taxes by inflating our

home values. Recycling should not be considered a "bonus" "extra" or benefit. It is a necessity. BRING BACK RECYCLING!!!

Considering the taxes that citizens pay plus the taxes that will be collected from all of the business that will occupy all of the office space the city approved to be built in addition to current business taxes, I think recycling service can be paid for easily by the city or with a very minimal fee from citizens. The service will highly increase recycling efforts as most people are willing or able to put recycling materials in their vehicles to transport to one of the few stations offered right now

Please bring back the curbside recycling. More people would recycle items again.

I think it is very important to recycle as many materials as possible. I am not willing to pay a fee because our taxes are high enough and it's a service the city needs to provide

Please bring back curbside recycling that truly works, meaning that the materials actually get recycled rather than thrown in a landfill.

I think there needs to be a fee so that those who want to recycle will follow recycling guidelines hopefully. Education on how to recycle properly would help as well.

Piss poor leadership in the city of Chesapeake.

When you took away recycling we did not have a reduction in fees but we took a huge hit in services. Trash services were horrible for months and we are just getting back to normal.

Thank you for considering bringing back the recycling program in Chesapeake.

We just moved from to Chesapeake from Virginia Beach about a month ago. We currently have a lot of cardboard due to unpacking and simply don't have time to bring it all to a recycling site. The bulk pickup for these flattened cardboard boxes in Chesapeake is hit or miss at best. Because we don't have a separate blue trash receptacle, we have one brown receptacle for all our trash and potentially recyclable materials. Our trash volume has doubled because of the volume of recyclable materials going into the garbage. We would be in favor of paying a small monthly fee to take care of curbside recycling.

Glass should be included in recycled items accepted

Please reinstate curbside recycling. It is a better "look" for our city and aligns with what we try to teach our children.

Even with a fee or reduced pick-up schedule it would be a great "readdition" to Chesapeake.

It is a waste of gas to drive to a drop off site only to find that the bins are full. Curbside side recycling saves the taxpayers the time, trouble, and gas money of driving around town to drop off their recyclables. Plus there are no bins for glass so all of that material just ends up in the landfill now. Also my husband and I are both disabled and the bins are not handicap accessible.

Good question to ask is how much recycling in the city has dropped. It's clear recycling "compliance" at collections sites is good, but that is b/c

people dropping off have a passion for playing their role in sustainability. I will bet volume of recycling in the city has dropped 70+% or more. All my neighbors now use the recycling cans for trash pick up every week. Sad to see so much plastic etc going into landfills.

I really hope the council will vote to resume recycling.

We always filled our recycling bins, and we had twice as much recycling as trash. Sadly we currently do not use the drop-off locations. We want the home service back and would pay \$10 a month.

Please! reinstate our curbside recycling pick up! I was never informed that we had a city drop off recycling things. I take mines at food lions but they are always super full.

Recycling is not a want, It's a need! It is our responsibility to try and take care of the earth as best we can! Our tax dollars are being spent on things that are not as important! "

Please do not bring back curbside recycling until a viable option exists. Too much of the recycling ended up in the landfill anyway. The only thing the program did was make people feel good. It was a very poor way to truly recycle.

Recycling is a simple, but necessary action that we all must take in order to protect our only planet and the sensitive environments. Especially living on the coast, so close to the ocean, we must do all that we can to prevent any excess harm to the ocean.

We really miss the recycling offered by the city and hope it returns.

The only recycling we do now is cardboard. We use the drop off site for that. Otherwise all plastic, glass, paper, goes in the trash.

In this current battle of climate change and the need to find ways to reduce, reuse, and recycle I find it appalling that the Hampton Roads city with the highest property tax has cut recycling! I understand that the recycling program has been inefficient and therefore costly. Perhaps a concentrated, targeted education campaign to inform citizens of what is appropriate to be recycled would increase efficiency and reduce the costs. Dropping the program altogether seems to have had an opposite effect in our neighborhood. Now on trash days a great many people have their regular can and recycle can out for pick up. How does that allow the city to save money, reduce the workload and pay the employees more?

EDUCATION IS THE KEY! PLEASE don't let us be just another statistic as a city more concerned with cost and profit over what needs to be done for our world!

The city needs glass collection sites. Glass is easily recycled. With the current tax rate per household there should be zero excuse for the lack of recycling services in Chesapeake. As this city spends money to build more infrastructure for businesses and housing they can allocate their budget for city services such as trash, recycling, and street cleaning.

When recycling was offered by the city, we recycled more than we put in the trash. I know many people were upset when it ended. I think we pay enough in taxes to have this service included. I realize there were issues with the previous recycling service but I think it would benefit the citizens of Chesapeake if new alternatives were investigated. Everytime I throw away stuff I used to recycle it upsets me.

There are countries that recycle almost every bit of trash. If that were the case, then I'd be willing to pay more for recycling. I think we should take a stand against plastics. Our community should encourage companies to have us bring in our old container to have it refilled with clothes detergents, hand soaps, vegetable oil, etc.

I think we pay enough waste management fees to cover curbside recycling. We can hardly afford groceries so I won't be paying for recycling as important as I think it is. I have to keep a roof over our head and feed us first!

A bigger effort needs to be made to educate and inform citizens as to what and how to recycle, especially after a year of using the blue bins for trash. I had to be diligently pro-active in keeping up to date on what items were allowed in the bins whenever changes/clarifications were made. Most

people aren't going to make the effort to educate themselves so clearly written, easy to understand information needs to be provided to every household on a regular basis in order to keep trash out of the blue bins and establish the most effective recycling program.

I don't drive so I'm unable to utilize he drop off sites. I wouldn't mind paying for a private service but people I've talked to have had problems with the current companies.

If the program will not pay for itself through reduced landfill cost and sale of recycled materials it should not be done. Subsides to meet a green feel good project have no place in our fiscal budget.

There should be a way to recycle glass. Putting glass, especially broken glass (fluorescent bulbs, window glass, broken bottles) in a landfill is a terrible choice.

We stopped recycling when the City stopped providing curbside services and are still disgusted by this environmentally-irresponsible decision. Paying a private company for what our taxes are supposed to cover is not a viable answer nor is placing the onus on the residents to deliver their reclables to bins at outside locations. Further, those councilmembers who ran their campaigns in support of reinstating curbside recycling services need to step up and get it done. Final note: there was no corresponding adjustment in property taxes to reflect the elimination of curbside recycling services. To the contrary, property taxes rose substantially since then. There's something very ethically & environmentally wrong with entire this scenario.

I'm a senior citizen. I tried to save items to take to the recycling center, but I don't have the space to store them. Too difficult for me to get the items out

of the blue recycle bins to drive to the recycling center.

Please bring back curbside recycling immediately. The decision to get rid of it was extremely irresponsible, unnecessary and inconvenient for the citizens of Chesapeake.

I would consider paying more per month if glass were included. Currently I have to haul glass out of town, which is a huge hassle. The drop off site I use is okay, I have only had one experience when the bin was quite full, but people seem not to be using it properly (items are in plastic trash bags, pizza boxes, etc.) and I fear that the items don't even get recycled after all. Curbside recycling this day and age is a basic service that the city should provide to taxpayers free of charge. I would be willing to pay something because I care, but most people would not prioritize this, so the service really needs to be free in my opinion. Thank you Lacy:)

Let the people who want to recycle pay for the service, subsidizing a private company (TFC) for an unsustainable business model at the taxpayers' expense is not right. If recycling is important to enough residents the City should contract with a company for a subscription-based plan, if that is not economically feasible then the burden should not be imposed on those who do not wish to participate and pay yet another fee.

My street has never had recycling services to my knowledge. I dump my recycling at an office building. I would really like ALL Chesapeake residents to have an opportunity to recycle.

There should be no extra fee to replace the former service for which we were not required to pay an extra fee. Charging an extra fee is just another tax that will NEVER go away. Chesapeake collects enough taxes already. If this service cannot be provided without assessing citizens an additional fee, then the program would be just one more example of government that

is unable to efficiently run itself by cutting "nice to have" things elsewhere to provide this service for all citizens.

I was paying for a service through local taxes and fees. Without even getting a chance to select an alternative option this service was canceled and I did not recieve a refund.

This is wrong. I have never heard of a city REDUCE the level of service provided and continue to charge the same amount of money it collects from taxpayers. Im not putting trash inside my passenger vehicle to chauffeur it to a center in horrible traffic. This is putting taxpayers last. Im sure other freebee giveaway programs werent sacrificed to bridge the budget. Those who work and pay taxes get screwed.

I don't recycle because I don't have a vehicle to haul the recyclables to a drop off location. The barrier to entry is too high and unreachable for me and my family. I'm willing to pay a nominal fee similar to drain water - heck, roll it into that fee, to support recycling.

Chesapeake needs recying. I live on a street with 13 houses and I am the only home that recycles. Weekly, recyclable items are put in blue bins by everyone else in the neighborhood and left out for trash pickup on trash day. There has never been a contract recycling company on our street; the bins are picked up along with the brown trash bins by the City's contracted trash hauler on our trash pickup day. Larger items, such as carborad boxes, are burned.

Curbside recycling needs to return. We are killing our environment over the Council's a fear of a small fee for recycling service."

The trash trucks have been seen at the drop off sites mixing everything

together like trash. I used to work in the recycling center at Oceana. This is not effective and makes the product unusable. I recycle now by reusing at home as best I can.

While I would pay \$5 a month, I think recycling services should be free pick up.

We consume a lot and what better way to better our city

Please bring back curbside recycling. Chesapeake took a huge step backyard when it was discontinued. If we want to be future thinkers and planners, we need to step back into this century.

I would love to have a program that recycles glass

I'm disappointed that the drop off site does not take glass. When curbside was offered I think 15 to 20 percent our recyclables were glass jars and bottles. These now go in the trash.

I am really ad that you did away with curbside service. If we have to pay for it, I would be willing to pay as I feel it is very impis very important to recycle.

Regarding my answer to question 8, I'm willing to pay \$6-10 or \$11-15 per month as long as the program accepts ALL plastics (1-7) and glass in addition to all other materials.

There should be a quality program of recycling. A program that does not provide the best benefits for the community and the environment is not what we need.

Accessibility for my neighborhood is excellent because the recycle pickup containers are within 1/4 mile at the library on Taylor Rd.

We were disappointed enough at City Council's decision to end curbside recycling that we kept a list of the

Council members that voted against curbside recycling determined not to vote for them in the future. I believe all but one of them chose not to run for re-election. We're not normally a ""one issue"" household but on this issue we decided it was important enough not to take into account their voting records on other issues. That said until 4/1 we have continued curbside recycling by utilizing a private company (Happy Planet) who have been great - they took any plastic 1-7, all paper and cardboard. We are now forced to use the drop off site at City Park since Happy Planet has had to discontinue their service - what a shame, soooo much better than the old TFC recycling with their restrictions/limitations. If there is any feasible way to reinstitute affordable curbside recycling I expect most Chesapeake residents would be very appreciative.

As a senior citizen, using the drop off sites is a challenge, and I expect most of us ""of a certain age"" will just stop recycling rather than struggle to ""do our part."" It's important to us, something we have done for decades and we don't want our household plastics, paper and card board going to the landfills if at all possible. We will be actively following Council's deliberations and decisions regarding recycling.

We know there are many fiscal challenges facing our City but curbside recycling should certainly top a number of ""beautification"" projects that have been funded in the past.

Thank you for canvassing interest in restoring this important service. I was

shocked that the City of Chesapeake discontinued curbside pickup especially with our current environmental concerns. Current drop off sites accept limited recyclable materials, e.g. no glass, only plastics #1. It is hard to throw away glass when it is very recyclable. I do my best to drop off materials when I can because I try to be environmentally conscious but it is not convenient with my schedule and there are times when the bins are overfilled. All of my neighbors, retirees and working families, participated with recycling when it was curbside, but I know I am one of a handful now who actually uses the drop-off site. Thankfully the drop-off site is nearby, otherwise if it were any further, I would likely not recycle because of inconvenience, time and gas.

We started recycling at the Deep Creek location. It was inconvenient and hard to find initially. After a few times we stopped. We participated fully when we had pick up.

BRING CURBSIDE RECYCLING BACK!!! It such a pain in the butt to have to take it up to park twice a week!!! HUGE inconvenience!!!!!

Let's bring back recycling and keep the public informed what should and should not be recycled.

Our real estate taxes went up due to increased property assessments but now we do not have curbside recycling so we are paying more and getting less city services. On our next city election, I'm voting for pro curbside recycling city council members.

We were happy with the recycling program Chesapeake had in place and would like to see it reinstated. We would be glad to pay a monthly fee of \$16 to \$20 for the service.

Taking recyclables to drop-off centers is extremely inconvenient for older residents like myself.

It's useless. I used to work for TFC. People treated each can like another city trash can. Yes some people followed the rules but not the majority. It was a good ride for tax write offs but it's had its run.

I have a problem getting around and curbside recycling would be much better. I was curbside recycling before it was stopped. I cannot get to the the recycling stop. I really want to recycle.

We were upset about not being able to recycle glass, but we said it was worth it because you were taking more plastics. Then two months ago the signage at the drop off said that we could no longer recycle plastics above 2. If you took more recycling, we might be willing to pay more.

This is a basic service that should be provided by any respectable city government.

I am willing to pay the same amount we paid before. We were never given a refund for what we paid and they never picked up. I really think it's a sin that our city is willing to let recycling go to our landfill's. Its very embarrassing.

I have (2) blue cans that I filled up every other week! I now take my recycling to work and use their dumpster. PLEASE Bring it back!

For the current level of service, I am not willing to pay a fee. If more materials were accepted, I would pay a nominal fee. You currently don't take glass or any plastics above "2", that is not acceptable and leaves a lot of potentially recyclable materials headed to our landfills.

Please bring back curbside recycling. It is shameful that Chesapeake is the one city in Hampton Roads that doesn't provide curbside recycling. It shows a lack of pride in our city that we don't care for it by reducing the waste in our landfills and it shows incompetence on the part of leadership that you have been unable to find a solution when every surrounding city has done so. I voted against all the leaders up for reelection who voted against curbside recycling and will continue to do so if this is not fixed promptly.

I have paid for a private service since the city stopped collecting recycling, but it is infrequent and has been unreliable at times. Curbside recycling pickup was a great service that offered a mote convenient way to recycle. We miss the accessibility of the program, but still drop off recycling every week. My recommendation is to find an outlet to recycle glass. If the curbside recycling does come back, my recommendation is too provide more feedback anf guidance on contents that can be recycled. All of the items going into our landfill will create a negative environmental impact in years to come. Be proactive now.

Recycling is great. However, it only makes sense if there is a market for recycled materials. The city should not reinstate the recycling program until there is a long term, sustainable market for recycled materials. The city should not impose a tax burden on citizens to recycle materials.

Initially I LOVED that it least it meant I could recycle #1-7 plastics - but that has stopped.

Studies show that most recycled materials eventually end up in a landfill anyway, maybe not in the states, but in other countires. Because of this I do not want to pay for this service.

Yes, absolutely reinstate curbside recycling and educate people on how to properly recycle and what can and can't be recycled.

I recycle more iem than I do regular trash. When Chesapeake had the curbside recycle pickup, my bin was always out, ready for pickup. I made sure recycled materials were clean, and only put items allowed in the recycle bin. The closest drop-off site is out of the way from where I live. Luckily for me, the building I work in has a recycle pickup, which I've been using whenever possible. I would GREATLY appreciate it if Chesapeake restarted the curbside recycle pickup program, and took as many variety of recyclable items they can. I stated that I would prefer not to pay for pickup mainly because I feel I pay to much for regular trash pickup, which I hardly ever use. I put my regular trash bin out for pickup every 3-months. When I shop, I consciously purchase items I know can be recycled, which is why my trash bin hardly gets used. To have to pay for a recycling service in addition to my normal trash bill, would not be easy on me financially. If Chesapeake could come up with a way to bring back the curbside recycling, I'd use it, use it responsibly, and would truly appreciate it.

The program definitely needs to be reinstated. By having individual citizens driving to drop off their recycling, you are offsetting the whole purpose of recycling just from the fuel used to make the dropoff. And in some cases, likely causing more harm to the environment, than if no one recycled at all.

I would like to add, that contracting this duty to an outside company is not the right answer. I work for a local municipality (not Chesapeake), and can tell you from experience that contractors won't solve your problem. It's always more expensive in the long term. They pay their employees a similar rate and offer the same kind of benefits as city employees are offorded. The only difference is, they operate for a profit. If you need trucks, buy them. If you need people, hire them. But don't think that the answer is a ""for"" profit company. You are simply kicking the can down the road.

Why should we pay anything since our taxes didn't go down when the service was stopped and was paid for from our taxes.

We should not be forced to pay for something that the city currently provides for free. If recycling is important, use the current sites provided by the city.

The previous program worked well for us. However, we need to know how recycling is benefiting the community. Is there a cost benefit analysis available for review. We don't want to do it again if it has little or no impact on the environment or trash facilities. In addition, it would be good to know how the recycled materials used,i.e. to create energy, etc.

Want to recycle better for our environment. Too difficult for me to take to a recycling place.

I hope recycling will be reinstated.

The city should strongly consider and review the services it provides to our citizens in light of the increased property taxes we have experienced over the past two years. A ~33% increase in annual property taxes with no corresponding increase in services, and actually a decrease with the suspension of curb-side recycling; downright criminal. Current property taxes are nearing rental levels which changes the decision calculus of many normal folks. What makes you think that is right and that you can get away with it. Insane. Do you forget everything all the sudden when you are in charge?

The current site in the library parking lot is convenient. However, the multiuse container is locked on the far side. Because of this, the far/locked side is underutilized. The trash only fills the front half of the container, which fills up fast. I believe this turns people away because it looks full. Unlock the far side so that both sides can be utilized.

It is obvious that the City of Chesapeake's alternate recycling plan has not been effective. You can observe on any trash pickup day, bins overflowing with items that should be recycled. For some neighborhoods recycling stations are miles away making it inconvenient. It is also abominable what that is doing to our landfill areas. Our leaders took a step backwards when they voted to discontinue curbside recycling last year. I am hopeful our newest council members will rectify this.

I would like to include glass. I currently drive to Virginia Beach to drop off glass.

As long as ALL things recyclable are taken I'm willing to pay a fee to have them picked up again but if I can't recycle glass (as you currently can't do at the drop off sites but used to be able to curbside) and am not allowed to recycle yogurt containers and other plastics #3-5 then no I don't want curbside again. I can take what I can to the park and take my glass to a friend in VB and take my #2-5 containers to Whole Foods. But seriously, recycling shouldn't be this hard!

We really miss the recycling program. I am the only person in the house using the available recycling, which only accounts for about a 10th of our household recyclables. We want to be responsible around waste and its relationship to climate control, but the current situation is only convenient for me. Everyone else is leaving the recycling in with the regular weekly garbage pickup.

We were using Happy Planet Recycling (private company suggested on the Chesapeake website), but they just discontinued their regular services and you have to resign up at a gigantic price hike. Their rate went from \$20/month to \$100/month which is absolutely insane.

We recycle more materials than we trash in our household. With the current state of the planet and growing size of the trash mountains in the Chesapeake/VA beach area, Curbside recycling seems like a worthwhile use of the taxpayer money. Please please reinstate it.

We pay a decent amount of real estate tax, water sewage and waste tax, and our taxes continue to increase, and yet the vote was not about what the people wanted or needed but instead what city council prioritized. It is a shame that people in Chesapeake should be asked to shoulder additional fees, with inflation and the fact that we did not agree with this decision to

I currently pay \$12 a month of bi-weekly curbside pickup. This service is incredibly reliable, I can track the driver and they will notify my if they are unable to come pick up recycling. I would also like to see weekly recycling if we are to go back to a city sponsored program. Bi-weekly and 1 trash can was not enough. With my current plan I can put out as much as I want.

I have been an avid recycler for ever. I believe the city should be responsible for helping the citizens to preserve our resources and continue to have a healthy city for future generations.

Please bring back the recycling with a fee as an option. We were using Happy Planet but they just had to shut down. We are going to try the drop off locations, but they are not convenient to our work or home.

I hope the city is able to find an affordable solution for our community. This is an important service and friends in other cities are shocked to learn that Chesapeake no longer offers a solution.

Please bring back curbside recycling! My family's recycling habits declined considerably since the service was stopped due to the reduced convenience. It's important for the city to set a good example for its children/ young citizens.

The current drop off site works well for our household except that glass is not accepted. To encourage more recycling, I think garbage pickup should be changed to bi-weekly pickup, except in extreme hot weather, or fees should be charged for garbage pickup in some form such as pay per pickup or by the pound. Our household of 4 adults sort out the recyclable items and our weekly garbage can is rarely half full and make a weekly, or less often, trip to the collection site at City Hall to drop off an average of one container full of recycling. More education, enforcement and recycling options are definitely needed.

I strongly believe that the city manager can make room in the budget for curb-side recyclable without assessing a fee on residents. I think with better management there is money to cover the costs.

There should be a bidding process for industrial re-cyclers to make a contract with the city. Perhaps, instead of pick-up schedule of once every two weeks, it could be less frequent. Once per month could work for a lot of households. If necessary, offer a bigger pick-up bin to those who would need it. I do not mind the current arrangement of self drop-offs, as long as it does not require an added tax. As I have already said, I strongly believe that the city manager can make a budget that encludes curb side recycling at no additional tax to home owners.

How does the city handle its own waste dispossal? Do the city offices recycle?? Do the city departments have a contract with a recycler? I think (I'm not sure) that businesses already have contracts for trash and recycle pickups.

Our household regularly filled 1-2 curbside containers of recyclables and 1/2 container of trash.

We had used recycling for 20 years prior to it being cancelled. I voted specifically for candidates that stated they support recycling in Chesapeake. If it is not restarted, I will be voting against each of the five newly incoming members in the next election. The private recycling companies are not nearly as easy as the city service used to be. The drop off locations are a joke, hence why we don't use them. Additionally the special recycle items like electronics are extremely difficult to recycle. Drop off 1 or 2 days each month on a Wednesday. If you have a job, good luck using that horrible service. I suspect most items just go into the regular garbage. Chesapeake definitely has a well below average recycling and waste service. Reinstate the recycling program now.

While I would like to recycle, I feel we already pay enough in taxes and fees.

I feel like we need to think about of communities as well as our children and

thier futures. With not recycling what are we teaching them? That money matters more over them and where they live? I should hope not!

I would be willing to pay a fee up to 20 dollars, as long as there was transparency with the selected recycling program. I believe that recycling is a vital part of reducing our footprint, and to take that away is only accelerating the harmful effect on our environment.

Recycling is imperative for the earth. Teach our kids how to do things the right way.

We can only recycle with curbside pick up. We are not able to physically go to drop off.

For the answer above regarding aluminum/tin, that includes the aluminum cans that we take to Chesapeake Animal Services.

While we did not like losing glass recycling (or curbside recycling), it was a trade off for Plastic #5 recycling which was then quickly removed from the eligible items, leaving Chesapeake with less recyclable items. Other jurisdictions manage to allow for glass and Plastic #5 recycling, so there are clearly options available. For us, we are currently "trading" glass and Plastic #5 recyclables with family and friends in other jurisdictions (in exchange, we take their aluminum cans to Chesapeake Animal Services (which collects cans to raise money for its medical fund (a recycling option that the City should promote, and make it easier for people to contribute to), their pill bottles to area animal shelters and rescues, and their plastic bags to York County (which is collecting them to help its community obtain new community benches made from recycled plastic, which project is something Chesapeake should look into)). All the while, our garage looks like a recycling center with different bins, and a big blue Chesapeake curbside bin uselessly taking up space (we do not need it for trash, as we do what we can to recycle). We want curbside recycling (and, if the general fund cannot cover it, we understand a small fee for it (but not a fee that helps with other budget items (which seemed to many what the Manager was trying to do last year)), but with significant excess funds mentioned in Summer 2022 as being available for use for something else while curbside recycling was cut, many doubt the need for an extra fee of any kind, and the Manager needs to explain this.

This service should be covered under the current fees paid

We already pay a fee for trash collection. Recycling should be encouraged by the city! Making people pay for it isn't an incentive. They will throw it in the trash can and be done with it!

At the drop off sites, it would be great if you would include glass also!

We have been recycling since we moved to Chesapeake from Northern Virginia in 1991. We used the drop-off locations before the curbside recycling began. We were very careful with the curbside recycling to NOT include items that did not meet the requirements. When curbside recycling ended last year, we started using the drop-off recycling again. It was EXTREMELY disappointing to find that the originally stated Plastics #1-#7 was changed to ONLY #1 and #2 WITHOUT notifying anyone. As well, there is NO excuse NOT to allow through #7. Finally, PLEASE find a way to allow glass to be recycled! Glass thrown into landfills will be there forever! The fact that we will pay \$10/month INCLUDES all plastics and glass!

Thank you for taking time to consider this issue. As a planner, considering future studies on impacts of starting / stopping service seems to have not been conducted-funded and was led by a singular person in the city government who had no expertise. Without hiring out this type of costbenefit analysis study (or funding within the planning department) it seems very likely that many city resources were lost without the benefit of anyone

and to the detriment of all stakeholders. Hope that this future effort is funded/studied to determine best use of resources of city. Hope findings show a real cost benefit to providing such a service (demand). City land still costs to operate on, employees to adequately staff drop off sites, transport materials, etc. All in all, as a community planning/facility engineer that conducts these types of studies frequently, I remain skeptical of the true benefit/cost of stopping the recycle program and believe it may have put further burden on city resources. Wish Chesapeake the best of luck in discovering a way forward with the recycling challenge.

Please bring back curbside recycling pick up.

80% of my garbage is recyclable materials. I have been with Happy Planet since the city discontinued the recycling program and I was very happy. However, they have discontinued their service as well due to costs. I am so disappointed as I now have to throw perfectly recyclable materials into the trash which will ultimately wind up in a landfill. This makes me feel very irresponsible to our planet and very discouraged knowing I'm unable to contribute to the health of our planet.

We only recycle paper and cardboard. Before the city stopped collections we recycled paper, cardboard, glass, and and plastic but at age 86 but it is too much of a problem to drive to the center as we both have illnesses. If there was a city pickup we'd recycle everything. How much recycling do our councillors do?

I used to be a recycler but find it too difficult to do since Chesapeake stopped recycling services but be willing to pay a ssmall fee to reinstate it. Also, when I did recycle, I was aware of which items could be recycled & tried my best to adhere the rules BUT I don't think everyone were as aware of the ""do & don'ts of recycling rules""; (it was somewhat complicated.)

Recycling is important to me. When the program stopped I started taking my recyclables to family homes in Norfolk and Va Beach because those cities accept more items. And I didn't want to have to sort through everything at Chesapeake sites.

Recycling guidelines should be made as clear and accessible as possible

Chesapeake: it is abused then fine folks, but don't discourage us who do the right thing. If you need to limit what can be recycled and least take cardboard, paper, glass and aluminum. Or make is presort into separate containers.

Please bring back recycling. The private company does ok but it is slightly more of a hassle recycling with them than the city. Most people may not care enough to directly pay for recycling but it helps the environment and minimizes landfill waste. Do what is right, not what is cheapest! Thanks.

My percentages above relate to when the city provided recycling. I do not recycle now, because it would cost me about \$8 in gas for one round-trip to go to a drop-off location on top of the 45 minutes minimum of my time, and having to put all that stuff in my car. We used to fill up our blue can every two weeks, and many times we held recycling items over because our blue can was completely full. We were always very careful to only put approved recyclable items in our bin, and we still always filled it up. Because of being able to recycle so much, that made our brown can only have a bag or two each week. Now we completely fill our brown can every week and many weeks have to also put the blue can out for the trash man. I would gladly pay a monthly fee to have this service through the city. I can't even imagine how many more tons of garbage goes in the landfills now that all

the recyclables are going to the landfill instead of being picked up by a recycling company contracted through the city.

I have lived here since 1992 and feel that the City of Chesapeake gets enough nickels and dimes our of me that I should not have to pay any additional funds to recycle goods that they will ultimately get the benefit. Currently I take my recyclables to a friend/relative's house in a near city and deposit into their recycle bin. Occasionally I use the drop off in front of Food Lion. I do not know what % of my recyclables is of what material. I had to answer that i currently do not recycle as your question did not have an answer that fit.

I appreciate that the area around the drop off site is clean and that the bins are emptied regularly. Curbside pickup would obviously be more convenient, but I live near a dropoff site so I don't mind using it if the alternative is dumping recyclables in the trash

Chesapeake should provide curb side service.

When I was a kid my dad had us help him recycle. We would separate them, tin from glass from cardboard and newpaper. We would take them down the street to TFC. I remember when Chesapeake started with the small blue boxes, which were not big enough for us to stop dropping it off ourselves, and eventually getting the blue bins. When I moved back to Chesapeake I was excited to be able to use curbside recycling again after living where I had to drop it off myself. Now I'm doing that again and I'm so disappointed. I'd love the bins to come back, as someone who wants to buy a house in Chesapeake instead of rent.

My neighborhood requires minimum police, fire, school, road, etc expense. Average real estate tax bill is in excess of \$5,000 per house. I would think

the City could provide trash removal including recyclables without any additional fees or taxes

Recycling is important. Most families will recycle if curbside is offered. Drop off is very inconvenient and many just stop as a result.

I'd be willing to pay a fee for recycling if the program was well developed and accepted a wider variety of materials, including plastics #3-7, glass, and cartons. Why don't we have drop-off bins for cartons when TFC accepts cartons for recycling via mail from all over the country as only one of four facilities in the nation?? Why would I mail TFC my cartons when they're located RIGHT HERE in Chesapeake? A single stream recycling drop-off bin for glass like the purple bins in northern Virginia also seems

like a missed opportunity here in Chesapeake as we have glass processing facilities both north and south of us in Toano and North Carolina. Even if these aren't in curbside recycling, it doesn't make sense that we have no opportunities to drop-off glass or cartons for recycling in Chesapeake. The current recycling program is disappointing and would be so much better with more options and consistent communication. The program started out with residents being able to recycle a much wider variety of plastics than the curbside program previously offered and several months later stopped accepting anything outside of #1 and #2 plastics without communicating this anywhere other than on the small print on the poorly placed signage on-site and on the internet that you'd have to check frequently to know if there were any changes. People can't recycle the correct things if they aren't notified properly of changes. Many residents are willing to go the extra mile. The city can do better on their end so we (as residents) can be better participants.

Chesapeake we live in the country and we don't have many police that come to our area. In 33 years we have lived here trash and recycling are really the only services we have. Fire there has only been one. Storm Water they rarely clean our ditches or our storm drains. They only clean our streets twice a year and usually when we hardly have any leaves but we have lots of trees in our neighborhood. Our houses are valued at 750.00 dollars and we pay lots of taxes on our three acre lots. You all need to do away with unnecessary top brass and pay for our reclyables."

We do miss having curbside recycling and have to empty our kitchen trash more frequently!

I AM A SENIOR CITIZEN WITH DIFFICULTY GETTING RECYCLE MATERIALS TO LOCATIONS. HAVING IT PICKED UP AGAIN WOULD BE A BLESSING FOR SURE.

By discontinuing curbside recycling and the types of materials we are allowed to recycle has increased the amount of materials we are putting in the trash now. Also, the bins provided At the drop off locations are not easy to access to recycle a lot of material."

In Chesapeake it is criminal that with our current knowledge of the environment that we do not offer curbside recycling

I miss curb side recycling. I really appreciate the effort and convenience of my drop off site in the Greenbrier area. The city should probably raise taxes by a few coins and have residents pay."

The city has done a tremendous disservice to its residents, Hampton roads, and the environment by discontinuing curbside recycling in 2022 and half-assing the collection center locations (number, size, and materials allowed). Discontinuing the curbside service virtually guarantees that the

blue bins will never be filled with actual recyclables, if they ever were in first place - residents have become habituated to viewing them and their contexts as trash, eliminating any distinction or discretion they showed before. Failing to provide the proper capacity, number, and range of recyclables at the drop off sites discouraged many from using them - I recall seeing piles of cardboard/etc stacked next to a handful of maxed out bins in July and August of 2022. Lastly, it is offensive that this survey implies the budget, after the 20% real estate assessment increases, can not accommodate a proper recycling program. Stop buying random plots of land in the fucking swamp and trying to call it an industrial park and do your god damn job.

I am happy with my private recycling service and suspect those of us who pay for the service do a much better job of keeping non-recyclables and contaminated products out of the recycling stream than when everyone had the previous City curbside service. It would be great if the City could negotiate with a vendor to establish a City-wide pay-to-recycle service to minimize out-of-pocket costs for the citizens who agree to individually pay for the service. If that is not practicable, then I would really like the City to provide glass recycling services at the drop-off sites.

I tried to take my boxes to the drop-off sites but they were often full. I prefer to recycle and am willing to only recycle what the company will take. It needs to be advertised as to what the company takes in recycling.

Please bring it back!

Please be environmentally responsible, and bring back curbside recycling.

My condo association does not have city recycling at this time. But when I move I would like the city to contract with a provider for curbside collection, marketing for education on how to recycle.

I recommend LARGE STICKERS that have instructions that not only state what is allowed, but WHAT IS NOT allowed. I imagine the costs add up when wrong items are placed in the bin.

I currently go to the Greenbrier park recycling center. Maybe it is just me, but they are always full.

This was a shortsighted decision last year. Definitely a reason to no longer be proud of Chesapeake.

The city site should accept glass recycling.

Short sighted action to cancel curbside recycling. Lack of insight, logical thought is typical of the idiots serving (sic) / representing (sic) the taxpaying, revenue providing, basically screwed over inhabitants of Chesapeake. Time to vote out the incompetent incumbents (VOI2).

How was the previous program paid for?

We miss the curbside but enjoy the flexibility of dropping off at out convenience vice having to wait for the scheduled day.

I can't even believe the city would stop recycling in the 1st place. But I would love to have it back. I was so disappointed in the city that I've lived in my whole life (45 years) when it got cancelled.

Large families like mine do not have the storage capacity to store

recyclables at our home until we have time to take them to a drop off site that is over 10 minutes away if there is no traffic on battlefield. We used to fill out blue container faster than our trash and followed the rules as to the types of plastic, etc... All of our recyclables are currently going in the trash. I don't have a garage to sort them in and our shed is full.

I'm all for taxpayer cost savings, and I'm no liberal, but we recycled faithfully every 2 weeks. It made us feel like we were making a difference to our environment and our community.

Discontinuing the recycling program to save only a few million dollars a year seemed really short-sighted for the long run.

We do our best to recycle at the Old Greenbrier Library, but best intentions too often fall by the wayside. Many times our blue bin full of glass, plastic, and cardboard/paper just ends up being put out with the trash every few weeks. It makes me feel guilty every time it does.

Even if recycling were monthly instead of every other week, I'd feel better about our community not creating just another Trashmore.

Would be fantastic to see the city of Chesapeake reinstate weekly recycling with our existing blue containers! When I drop off my recyclables at the drop-off station off of Rt 17 down by the canal, it is very discouraging that I am always the only person there, and most of the bins are almost completely empty. And, every single one of my neighbors in the Oak Manor section of Chesapeake rojutinely are stuffing their blue containers with trash and rolling them to the curb each week alongside their brown trash containers, so obviously they are not taking their trash to a recycling dropoff station! Please take action to bring back curbside recycling to Chesapeake, for the good of our environment. THANK YOU.

Chesapeake city leaders should be embarrassed for their decision to end curbside recycling. Shame on them. When much of the country is progressing in their efforts, we're going backwards. Given the general lack of vision and leadership the council has shown it come as surprise a workable solution couldn't be found.

I would love to have curbside recycling. As of now I have not recycled since it's not convenient for me.

I'm saddened that this program was dropped. I was an avid recycler. But as a senior with health issues and being a caregiver it is not convenient for me to lift/haul, drive to another location to continue to recycle.

As a busy family of 5, it has not been practical to collect enough recyclables, load them in our vehicle and take them to a drop off site. It would become problematic having it all sit in our home. Now we have no choice but to throw it all away.

For everyone wanting to save the planet this has blown my mind. Please bring it back!!

Taxes are paid to provide this service. Help the environment.

We have not used the drop off service since it is reported as always being full. We are currently saving our aluminum for drop off at Chesapeake Animal Services but only after build up in the garage. We want home recycling services returned.

I think it is a terrible that Chesapeake does not provide recycling. We pay high taxes in Chesapeake and what we receive for it seems less comparable to surrounding cities.

The drop of sites don't include a lot of recycling materials and they are full often. Why not include items that can be profitable for the city?

Please reinstate curbside recycling! Many residents that recycled in the past no longer do so. That has surely increased the volume of trash collected and increased tipping fees. I also believe we could do a better job of educating residents on what is acceptable in the blue bins... Possibly, with a small flyer in city tax bills, or flyers at the rec centers and libraries. That can help ensure more efficient recycling.

Please bring curbside recycling back! Even though we pay a private service for recycling now, I miss the city service. I also believe it's an important service for any city to offer these days, even if citizens must pay.

I'd like to be able to recycle glass jars and bottles.

I would definitely use the city if they restarted the program.

Are used to recycle everything and was very disappointed when Chesapeake stopped the program.

Manage the money that are already paid in taxes by businesses and residents. Everyone has to allocate funds appropriately. It's no different for the city.

We already pay taxes that had included recycling. when it was stopped what happened to that money?

The recycling bins at the library site on Cedar Road filled up quickly, with the front section of the bins blocked by material so it was difficult to throw material in so it would reach the back of the bin. Both sides of the bins needed to be opened to fix that problem.

I will start to recycle when service starts up again.

Bring it back or most people won't recycle. We also have to wrap it in to other fees or people may opt out unfortunately.

I was an enthusiastic recycler when the service was provided by the city. Very careful not to include items that might contaminate the recyclables. But I'm not going to drive around with my recyclable trash looking for an empty bin because the city doesn't care enough to provide a reasonable alternative. If the city is to being back recycling, which I hope and would be willing to pay for, then I'd like to see the following happen. 1. Just include the charge in with the HRUBS invoice. 2. Include, if possible, glass in the program.3. For plastic I'd like to see not just plastic codes 1 and 2 like before but also include #5 as it's a popular plastic. Now if 3 and 4 could also be included that would be great. 4. Bring back the blue containers. 5. Make it VERY CLEAR to citizens that if they use the blue bins for trash they will a) get a warning the first couple of times and b) be fined (say \$25 for a first offense and rising if it continues) and c) termination from the program by removing their blue bin from their address. 6. Even though I answered that I""d pay \$6-10/month if the volume and contract issued (can other cities be consolidated to earn a better rate due to volume?) if the price could be a little lower that would be great. Thank You.

We have concerns about the drop off sites as we and others have observed standard garbage trucks making collections, not even the contracted GFL trucks.

I have a physical disability, on a fixed income, and live alone. It is a challenge for me to carry bins of recycling to a recycling site. Also, I can't afford to pay a private recycling company to come and pick up my recycling. When I recycle, I have about one bag's worth of garbage a week. Without recycling, I can have 3-4 bags of trash. With each bag of trash, Iget upset that the city stopped recycling. I live alone. With households where there are 4 people are more, I know they must have three to four times (or more) the amount that I have. I see the overrunning trash cans on streets in my neighborhood. I think that it's a shame that we've gone back to putting that much trash out on the earth. Curbside recycling was something for which I was very proud of my city of Chesapeake, that we were making a

difference in helping to save our planet. I hope that we can go back to curbside recycling. "

The 11% food tax and real estate and personal property taxes we pay should more than pay for curbside recycling

Please reinstate curbside recycling. The convenience and access makes it possible for more to participate.

When recycling was picked up our household had more in the recycle bin than trash can.

Honestly, it is unbelievable that such a large, established city ended their recycling program. Frankly, it's embarrassing that I'm living in a city that doesn't do curbside recycling. I have lived in far less established, cities, and even THEY had recycling as a normal program. We shouldn't even have to ask if our city provides curbside recycling- it's expected nowadays. Every single environmental study explains the importance of recycling vs trash; this is not a new concept. How do we teach our children the importance of caring for the environment when our city doesn't care to set an example.

Drop off bins are routinely full and unable to accept more material.

My family all recycled as we want to be mindful of our environment however do not have the extra time to take several trips to recycle drop off points. In my opinion it was the city's personal attempt to save the city money while still taxing its citizens for these services, with the amount of property taxes and other taxes that we pay as homeowners I feel that the city should negotiate contracts and bids with different companies in order to reinstate city recycling as it is more beneficial for the environment. As a resident of Chesapeake i feel as if that although it may cost the city to have bi-weekly recycling curb side service it would be more wear and tear on the regular curbside trash trucks that come and are now having to take more trash due to the utilization of both trash cans therefore shortening the time for them to have good time management and efficiency for weekly trash collection and therefore costing the city more. Other areas have noticed this trend as well. Glass is important to recycle and I know the manufacturers of Pyrex make use of them.

We miss the city recycling and never misses a pickup in the last 40 years here in Chesapeake

I am APPAULED at our City leaders for doing away with this service in the 1st place.. Many of my neighbors do not recycle or "think they are recycling because they STILL put recycled material in the blue bin ---since the blue bins are still being used as acceptable, they give the appearance of actual recycling being done. The drop-off containers are okay. I use the containers at the Hickory site

(Toll Station Road). It isn't very much by the locals. I might be one of the few people on my road that take their recycling to the containers. My elderly neighbors are able to take all of their recycling. They just put all their recycling in the trash. I've never seen the city recycling containers more than 30% full. Also, I can't understand why glass can't glass isn't recycled.

I think cities of our size should provide curbside recycling. I think there should be better monitoring of what people place in recycling bins.

HOWEVER, THERE ARE MAN Y STATES WHO PROVIDE REDUCED TAX COSTS.

I am happy with the city drop off site. I do not want to pay any fees.

I have never had any problems at our site in Wester Branch.

With the increase in real estate values and therefore property taxes the city can well afford the recycling program!

With taxes and assessments going up I do not feel like I am receiving the benefits that I am paying for. On our short street there are 4 elderly widows,

6 retired couples, and 5 families still employed. We are being taxed out of our homes by a city that does not seem to care about the long term residents that have supported the city for over 30 years each. Meanwhile city council and the planning commission allow builders to run roughshod over us with overcrowding, insufficient infrastructure, and not enough schools.

Take the money spent on drop-off sites and apply to curbside. Or, add glass to drop-off sites since it can be recycled over and over.

Our trash has more than doubled without curbside recycling. Please bring back curbside recycling!

In the days when we are being pushed to "GO GREEN" I am very surprised that the City of Chesapeake has made it so hard to difficult to recycle now. With our taxes getting higher by leaps & bounds, it is hard to believe that the city can no longer afford to provide this service. As a city I am appalled that you are not encouraging and supporting recycling like the rest of the world. The message that was sent was not a positive message to say that we are committed to a clean and purposeful community that is invested in a healthy future. I beg that we reinstate this for the future of Chesapeake.

I want to live in a city that cares about the environment. I understand that it costs money and I am willing to pay.

We had recycling as part of our trash fee, it should return to the same if reinstated. The city will be processing less trash if they reinstate recycling which will offset the costs to the city. "

Read / Heard the city revealed the drop off recycling cost 30% of what they were spending on the curbside program - great, except they were only collecting 10% as much as the curbside program, which simple math tells us they are now spending 3 times as much per pound. That means the decision to end the curbside program was CLEARLY unsound, from both a financial and environmental standpoint.

The reason that our household doesn't use the drop-off recycling is because we don't have a way to keep the materials at home prior to dropping them off. Our nearest drop-off point is nearby, at Deep Creek Locks Park, but the road leading back to the park can be difficult to turn left from as you're leaving. If it's rush hour (which starts between 2:30 and 3 pm on George Washington Highway), the traffic will back up, making it difficult to turn left to return home, so we would have to plan to drop recycling off when leaving the house and not needing to go back immediately.

We would have had no problems paying extra starting last year for the same service we were receiving at the time, but the city never offered citizens the chance to do that. Instead, they first told us that the contract was being ended because they didn't want citizens to have to pay more in their utility bills. Later, they changed it and said it was because we weren't doing it correctly - while at the same time, giving us the names and contact information for private companies, which costs more than what our bills would have been.

The City of Chesapeake should be ashamed of taking recycling away in the first place! So many residents were mad when recycling stopped. I'm glad this is being reconsidered!!!

Drop off location is available and has become easier to use with the addition of containers. The issue is not knowing when the containers would be emptied. If there were a provided schedule, it would assist in planning to use the drop off location when the containers are not as full.

We would love to see curbside recycling come back to Chesapeake. We never took anything to the city drop-off sites. At 70 yrs. old it was too much of a hassle. We always used the blue trash can. Please bring it back for the future of our planet.

I tried to recycle all items that was accepted into the city's recycle program. To help the environment, Chesapeake should definitely reinstate the recycling program. I am unable to use the drop-off sites due to my age (81) and caring for my husband with dementia. IMO, considering the rise of my real estate taxes, I think the program should be be be FREE.

The city of Chesapeake should continue to strive for a greener city. Reinstating the recycling program would be one step in this overall concept.

It's difficult to say what fee I am willing to pay because recycling faces many challenges. Many of them falling on the household and their attention to what can and cannot be recycled. Don't want to pay a fee and have the recyclable end up in the landfill. Would like all plastics (#1-7) to be included for recycling. All were originally included at the drop off sites but were eliminated shortly. Why the change? Would like glass to be included in recycling and not to be ground up and spread over the landfill. Know there is not a close facility accepting glass and transporting it is expensive resulting in a higher monthly fee.

Very much miss curb side recycling and distraught each time I have to put a glass bottle/container in my trash. Thank you so much for revisiting this crucial issue for our community.

Our children must learn that recycling helps to create new products and have less thrown into landfills.

We live in the Eagle Pointe 55+ community. City services are not provided to us regarding garbage not even regulated city water. We have always recyled in Virginia Beach and at the Compostelo bins in Chsapeake. The city needs to start picking up our garbage and if and when recyling. We pay our taxes to the city of Chesapeake and our gates are open for entry 8 to 5 seven days a week.

The city of Chesapeake needs to continue with the recycling program. There's too much trash to continue to be put in landfills when so many items can be recycled and reused. Many of the residents have gotten used to recycling and now it's extremely hard to just throw everything away!

With the taxes we pay already, the city should be able to provide a curbside recycle pick up at no additional charge. the products. If the concern is that things are being thrown into recycling bins that shouldn't be there, it could be beneficial to have extensive public education on what can be recycled and how to prepare it for recycling.

Compared to neighborhood cities, I feel we get much less for what we pay in fees and taxes. Recycling may not be a money maker but it is the right thing to do.

Please reinstate the curbside pickup and add the collection of glass. We have a modern city with some fine leaders. Failure to provide city wide curbside recycling is like going back in time - and not good for the city's image.

It is important for our family to help environmentally. The recycling is saving our earth.

Most of the materials slated for recycling go straight to the trash...I am not interested in paying a fee.

I wish the city drop off took glass. I hate to throw away glass items

I already pay a storm drain fee and my property floods. We already pay the highest real estate taxes in the area. I pay a huge sum of money to just own personal property. Go pack sand with your recycling fee!!!!

We pay enough in taxes that getting rid of all of our garbage should be covered. We take care of our own water & septic. There should be an allowance made because of that. And while I at it, we should not have to pay the stormwater tax.

I would just like to know why glass is not accepted at the drop off locations. We are trying to cut single use plastic out of our home, so we have turned to glass as an alternative. Between that and having to take the recycling to the location ourselves, while still paying for trash pick up (which used to include recycling), it just doesn't seem worth it. "

By not making recycling convenient, even at a low cost, I see most of my neighbors using their blue bin for trash. This means that our landfills are filling up even faster. Has the city addressed what will happen when our current landfills are at capacity? No one wants a landfill in their backyard. By bringing back curbside recycling, we can not only work towards keeping our environment clean but recycling is a source of jobs in a community. Recycling plants, the manufacture of recycled products and the creation of recycling-related materials like recycling bins all contribute to job growth in the economy. I would also like to see a broader education program implemented so people know exactly what can and cannot be recycled. I am willing to pre-sort our recycling if it makes it easier to decrease contamination leading to recyclable materials going in a landfill. Recycling is expensive but my family is willing to pay to have curbside recycling.

The city is still collecting the same amount of items but now the potential recyclables are just be handled as regular trash. Chesapeake is making no effort to become a more sustainable city.

You talk about wanting a cleaner city, bring back curbside recycling.

We have looked see real times at private services. The price points were doable.

Other city's pass the fee onto their residents whether or not they recycle. There are many other fees, taxes, etc that residents are expected to pay despite not using other service. I don't think recycling is any different.

I should not have to pay anything, the amount of taxes already being collected should cover it but no more than \$10 a month.

Our taxes never seem to be used for services they are allocated for, but you already know that, and yet they continue to raise.

This very much hits a nerve for another tax we pay, storm water, like I can control the rain.

I think it was ridiculous that the program was ever stopped, because you found something else to spend the money on, now you want to reinstate recycling and raise taxes again.

curbside recycling is more convenient, but we recycle just as much using the drop-off sites. We used these sites before the city started curb-side recycling years ago. We wish the current drop-off sites took glass as well.

We used to be good recyclers. However, the drop off centers aren't convenient for us. When paid services first were talked about, I thought I'd be willing to pay \$5-10. But then they were nearly double if I remember correctly. We took the recycle to a drop off for a bit, but it just takes too much time. So now the only recycling we do is aluminum cans to the Humane Society on Military because we can drop the bag and leave.

However, until all residents are onboard with How To Recycle Properly, you will have the same problems as with the previous curb side service, people do not prepare their recyclable material correctly. I walk my neighborhood and many times found the recycle bin filled with trash in plastic bags overfilling the container, yard waste, vegetable cans not cleaned laying on the ground and more. I would be willing to pay for my recycling with the city if they would take more than #1 and #2. Currently through the private service that I'm paying for, #1 - #7 is acceptable which means I recycle more items.

Chesapeake this should be included with what we pay in property taxes. I'm not advocating raising taxes but I'm sure there's bureaucratic stuff you can cut/trim to make this work.

Please bring it back

taxes are already too much, I'll throw my recyclables in the trash before I pay for what should be provided by the city. I suggest starting a deposit program for bottles and cans, people will be more acceptable of that, some folks will go around and pick up bottles and cans that are just litter.

Recyclops is the private service we use and it as been great. If the city ever explored partnering with them, I would endorse it.

I utilize the Deep Creek park recycle drop off which is well maintained and has adequate containers now

I would like to know why glass is no longer being recycled

I would like to know how much money the city saved this past year since curbside recycling was dropped

Recycling should be part of the price we already pay for trash disposal

It's embarrassing driving down the street on trash day and seeing containers packed full of cardboard that are going in landfills. It's embarrassing for the city. We.

City of Chesapeake needs to be pro active in making recycle available instead of street sweeping which is ridiculous. Make our city be on the map

as a conscious earth caring city. Also B caraway is not running RealEstate dept AT ALL. Take her Income apply towards recycling. WAY better use of my money after all the Citizens of Chesapeake we are your Employee. Just telling it like it is

With rising real estate taxes, the City of Chesapeake should be providing this service as part of waste management. "

While the private service is good to have, it's not the same. We are also limited on the amount we can recycle. Before we had a full city trash can sized container, now we're limited to about four garbage bag sized bags for the same time frame. We have piles of cardboard in the garage waiting for us to take to the local drop off that is just one more thing to remember. The city recycling also encouraged more people to participate and help make things at least a little better.

Recycling benefits all as we don't have overflowing trash sites, and helps make more recycled multi use items by manufacturers, and lastley teaches our children's that we all can do it together. It should be fully funded as our taxes are higher than other areas and was in place for years already. Taxes increase but things getting cut makes no sense. Also if funds are made traffic cameras that send out tickets at the intersection of George Washington highway and Moses grandy by the 7-11 as hundreds of cars run that light daily.

I feel guilty for not recycling but it is too much of an inconvenience to store and drop off my recyclables at a recycling location.

Assuming that recycling adds approximately 1/3 more volume to current trash disposal, SPSA tipping fees and additional trips of packer garbage trucks to SPSA transfer stations, are likely to reduce/ eliminate any cost savings for not recycling.

Chesapeake should bring back recycling as it was. The cost should be worth saving the environment

We have used Happy Planet Recyling for about a year. They charged \$25 for a twice monthly pickup. Glass was \$5 extra. They were reliable but required us to put everything in clear bags & leave it by our curb overnight. This is unsightly & attracted pests. On April 1st, they sent us an email terminating our service as of March, no warning. We would greatly appreciate paying for City recyling!

I'm a big proponent of recycling and how not recycling affects our environment. In a neighborhood of 20 homes, we are the only household who recycles after the City stopped its service. They're just putting everything in the trash and using the blue bin as well for trash, so now the City garbage trucks are having to collect 2 cans per household which to me is more wear and tear on the equipment.

It angers me that City officials authorized 100% payment for the recycling for over 30 years and didn't have the vision to ensure it's sustainability without somewhere along the line instituting a small fee for residents.

If the City of Chesapeake is truly "a City that Cares" they'll reinstate recycling for our young residents' future."

I don't have the proper vehicle to drop off recycling and can't afford a private service. But the majority of our garbage is recyclable. "

This is what my tax dollars shouted taking care of.

Recycling is important for many reasons, and Chesapeake should restart

curbside recycling using resources it already collects. You can't tell me there aren't efficiencies that can be made within the City of Chesapeake government, or luxuries that that would equal the cost of running the program.

Should that effort be a non-starter, then adding more recycling drop off locations would be needed."

My Property taxes are \$13,000 annually My Stormwater fees are \$40 biannually My personal 2 vehicle fees are \$608 annually My pet fees are \$16 annually I am fed up with paying MORE Chesapeake fees......

Recycling should not be an added fee. Make it part of the money we already fork over to Chesapeake..."

I would really like to see recycling come back. We have so many items that could be recycled, especially cardboard boxes. Thank you.

Due to being handicapped we are unable to use the drop off sites and having curbside pickup would be helpful and beneficial to us and the city

Our city needs to figure this out, otherwise the city is being irresponsible. Yet, I do know that residents did not pay attention to the guidelines. So the city needs to do a better job of informing and educating the recyclers.

I would like the city to reinstitute the recycling program s d we are willing to pay a fee for it

Resuming the recycling program is the responsible and most accessible option.

I currently use the drop off sites and am happy that this service is available. I would prefer curbside.

The city park location Mixed bin seems to always be overflowing, so I travel a little further to the central library that has a larger capacity.

The signage is confusing for which cardboard that should go in the mixed bin vs. Coregated cardboard that has a dedicated bin. I notice people putting all the brown paper board in the coregated bin.

Love that you accept more than plastic 1&2, but disappointed that glass is not accepted.

Citizens aren't going to recycle unless you make it convenient. All this recyclable material is just ending up in the dump. One of the things I loved about living in Chesapeake is the ability to recycle on a fixed income so any additional payments are a problem. i do believe in recycling and have always tried to abide by the recycling guidelines. it upsets me to see the guidelines ignored and items in the bins at my drop off site that aren't recyclable at this time. my daughter lives in a condo building and sees the same situation. She reaches in and removes incorrect items to the trash! A friend is currently staying in Japan and recycling is strictly adheard to. here we throw trash out on the street and don't seem to care about the environment or anything. a different mindset than how I was raised.

Please bring back recycling

The drop off site we use by the city buildings is clearly labeled and for the most part clean. The only reason why I don't like the drop off sites is how

inconsiderate the other citizens can be while driving through. If pickup returns I'll be much happier because it will be less time we have to spend lugging our recycle trash to a drop off site.

I would like to see a plastic bag fee at all stores. This would encourage people to use cloth bags.

As a community we should be recycling. You cannot expect residents to store sticky cans and cardboard trash at the house until they can drive it to recycling center. I don't buy the budgeting excuse. I have always been an avid recycler. I came from New Jersey where it was a requirement, with fines attached for non- Compliance. In a world where so many are concerned about Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, I was extremely disappointed that Chesapeake abandoned curbside pickup, having to realize that most people were just going to take the easy road and throw it all away. I currently take all my cans to Chesapeake animal services and, being a bit older, I also am throwing things away that I know I should be recycling. Please bring it back!!! I am willing to pay, just like I do for stormwater treatment. Why was I not given that option when this decision was initially made?

Eliminating curbside recycling was probably one of the most short sighted decisions the council has ever made.

Definitely in favor of reinstating the recycling program and willing to pay to do so. Our "throw-away" society is. Ot responsible enough to recycle without a progrM in place.

Although willing to pay for recycling we paid for recycling before and when the city cancelled it, we never saw and adjustment in our bill. Recycling is the RIGHT thing to do.

I live in Edinburgh and we do not have a well located drop spot.

Chesapeake does not have enough drop off locations to meet the needs of the community. Lack of glass recycling is also very bad. We are a modern, vibrant community that should be recycling.

We recycled before and it was working fine. We would do it again for a reasonable fee that could be added to our HRUBS Bill each time. All of the other cities in Hampton Roads do this and I never understood why the leaders of our city couldn't do the same. with the cost of everything getting so high, the fee has to be reasonable because people are struggling now to pay bills.

It was stupid to stop recycling in the first place!

What are we telling our kids, ""Fill up the Landfill!"""

Having a leaf bag collection every single week seems really unnecessarycutting back on leaf collection, especially during the summer months, could offset the cost of recycling. "

You guys really screwed this up if you are now reconsidering. If you return to a city managed recycling program, do it right and do not charge fees people can't/won't pay. Figure out a way to increase property taxes to pay for the program rather than expensive process of collecting additional fees.

Our taxes and fees paid for garbage pickup should cover this cost as in the past.

Recycling with private services is less than \$12 per month without glass; your survey does not permit actual cost. Citywide this should be signicantly less.

I'd appreciate the opportunity to let residents decide if they are willing to pay for a curbside recycling service.

I was incredibly disappointed when Chesapeake decided to cut out recycling. It should be brought back. Ideally it would at no cost to the residents, but if I have to pay, I don't want to be overcharged. And if I'm paying, the pickup service needs to be A LOT better too. Actually pick up my recycling on time. This applies to the trash pick up as well. The most irritating issues it trash and recycling pick up was never consistent. If my trash and recycling day is Friday, then I expect these to be picked up on Friday not Saturday or the following week sometime.

I'm happy that I got to keep my blue container.

We need ability to recycle glass. If not picked up please place a container for glass.

The idea that a city the size of Chesapeake does not offer curbside recycling is utterly embarrassing and unacceptable!

In this day and age it is a crime not to recycle. Half of our trash is recyclable. By the way it feels wrong to put glass in regular trash.

When we visited in Norway back in 2003 they had regular trash, recycled trash, and compost pick up."

Curbside recycling pickup had multiple advantages for residents.

Not only was it convenient, it also gave us a ""feel good doing our part"" for the environment.

And when explained to children they get an early education on the benefits of recycling.

There used to be a guide that listed things that were not approved for recycling. (I think at one time the guide was affixed to the top of the bin?) This included bottle caps, pizza boxes, etc. I understand that putting prohibited items in the recycling bins can cause damage to recycling equipment. If there is a possibility of having recycling resumed, residents should be made aware that recycling could be terminated again if people are not following the rules. Lastly, if recycling is resumed, provide a loud and clear guide to residents outlining the rules that includes the damage prohibited items can cause. And maybe a monthly reminder...... via mail, email, local news, etc.

I took my recycling one time to the drop off site. They were all overflowing and not sorted, so I didn't bother anymore. Multiple people have also reported seeing a trash truck empty the bins.

We would love to have the program back. It's such a waste to throw everything away, especially cardboard in a day and age when we have so many items delivered to the house in cardboard boxes.

The drop off locations are great. They are well maintained with the exception of me getting one flat tire from a small piece of metal, but that's not the City's fault...it just happened. It would be great if we could recycle glass.

It's about time and convenience. Finding the time to tote recyclables to a city location and hope it's not over used is a challenge.

Being very populous city, we must have recycling, even if it cost more than landfill. Of course I'd like to pay \$0 per month, but I know that may not be possible.

We sadly throw away our glass since we cannot put it in the City's bins.

We are extremely frustrated that Chesapeake stopped the recycling services. We reached out to private services with our names, phone numbers and emails and no one got back to us.

We have more recyclables than trash. It would be nice to have recycle pickup service again. Most of the time we can get our recycle items in the receptacles. A few times they have been full and not able to take any more items. We use the drop off location at the central library. Sometimes we drop off at city park; however those are small and usually full. Thank you.

Recycling should be part of the regular garbage/trash disposal provided by the city. Items that can be recycled should not be put in landfills, nor should residents have to take their recyclables somewhere special or engage and pay a company to do it for them. Many of my neighbors who used to place their recyclables in the blue trash cans regularly now no longer recycle because it became inconvenient. Please bring back curbside recycling. It is important.

Am happy with private service. Do not plan to return to city operated service and therefore am no willing to pay a fee for city services. I did all I could to maintain city service and no one listened. Too late now. Maybe at of my friends simply do not recycle. I choose to do so on my own. If a fee is added to city services I will not pay such a fee. I am tired of city leaders doing what they want in spite of what citizens want. I've never seen any evidence first responders benefitted from the savings as promised. I get exactly what I pay for

Removing Recycling services was a huge mistake and a step backwards. Should have listened to your constituents from the get go instead of removing the service. Reinstate Chesapeake recycling NOW!

All my neighbors on Windsor Point agree we need curbside recycling. We used it before and will use it again.

It was a poor decision on the city "leaders" to cancel recycling. Many are unable to pay for a private service and many are unable to take recycling to a center themselves. Our planet is already showing accelerated signs, caused by humans, of distress. We are senior citizens and want to do our part however it is difficult for us to load up all recyclables, and unload at the drop-off site. If there are large boxes my husband must take them because I am not tall/strong enought to reach the slot. We know a number of neighbors who do not recycle since the curbside pick-up ended. We are hoping it will be restarted by the city.

The drop off sites are well utilized and now are emptied more frequently. Initially, they were overflowing. I would love to have curbsite recycling again that includes glass.

Please find a way to bring back curbside recycling. I see lots of trash cans full of cardboard in them, or it is laying in the street.

Tried the recycle containers at Russell Memorial Library. The slot was high and narrow. I am not very tall, so it was it was ddifficult to reach. The narrow slot required that I take items out of my container and attempt to stuff them into the slot. I finally stopped taking recycle items to the facility and just dumped it all our regular trash. And it so very wast wasteful and bad for the environment.

Although I loved the curbside pickup, I cannot afford to pay for it. I wish the current drop off sites would include glass items. I realize most people who recycled before did not properly prepare the recycling. I used to complain about people putting trash in the recycle bins.

We would love to see recycling return, however, we heard much of it previously wasn't recycled and was just dumped anyway. If that will continue if it returns, we would not vote to bring it back and we wouldn't want to pay for something not actually happening.

We pay way to much taxes in this city as it is!!!!! I refused to give the city of Chesapeake more of our hard earned money!

I live close to a recycling pick up location. I find the locations MUCH more convenient than waiting every other week for the recycling pick up where I may collect more recycling than what could be held in the bin.

A majority of my bulk pick up requests in years past have all been cardboard boxes. Since the remote locations have been open I have cut down significantly on the amount of bulk pickup requests by breaking down my boxes and brining them to the location by my house.

My father in law has always collected and recycled all of my aluminum.

My glass products are now recycled at my company's recycled location since they started for employees when Chesapeake discontinued.

All in all my family is recycling MORE now and with greater frequency, using less city resources (bulk pickup) and couldn't be happier not having curbside pickup.

Canceling the recycling program tells me that city council does not care

about the environment, this is also evident in their gross overdevelopment of what used to be a decent place to live..

This should be included with the HRSD fees.

Loved recycling before because I think it's important. Must not be though if the city thinks we need to pay to do it.

I sincerely hope the city leaders decide to reinstate the recycle bin collection. I feel this helps and benefits our city and planet.

I have not seen the numbers, but part of the savings of not having a recycling program must be going back into the regular garbage runs. That should be considered when determining the cost of reinstating recycling.

The longer the garbage cans are out, the more likely they will be bumped into or blown over. Reinstating the recycling program will take a load off the regular runs."

I don't recycle each week. Only once each month. I do not wish to pay for recycling.

I have lived in Chesapeake for over 30 years and would enjoy seeing recycling back for good.

I am fortunate to have a recycling drop off center just down the road from my house, which I use weekly. The original containers were not sufficient, but the additional containers have proved to be quite nice. I do wish that they would include glass in the recycling efforts. I also think there needs to be a better description on the containers for what is and is not accepted. I see a lot of people who don't know what goes where and what is an is not accepted. A mailer to each household listing drop off locations and was excepted would be quite nice.

They need to bring back the convenience of recycle pick up. We have full time jobs and little children. It's too difficult to find a site and weekly drop off items. We would def pay fort the service to come to our house if it was offered.

No matter what the cost, we need the recycling program reinstated.

I feel we pay enough money in taxes and all the other necessities.

Drop-off containers are frequently overflowing and not emptied enough. This requires us to drive to at least two locations to drop off our recycling.

The city needs to either increase the number of bins or empty them more frequently.

I'm willing to pay a small fee as long as it's actually being recycled. If it's not even really being recycled, I say we just keep it gone.

If the city wants to charge for recycling, I would rather use the drop off, but of course its easy for me because I live in GB.

Seems like if you were willing to drive out to recycle you would read about what is accepted, but I guess not.

With so much growth in the city and increases in property tax, why would we pay for a service that was free to begin with? When that can be answered, I may or may not consider paying a minimal fee for this service. I do miss the service as we used to recycle a lot!

It is amazing to me that the city discontinued a valuable service and then increased real estate taxes.

I was just up north, and they accept many more types of plastic. They accept glass. And they have recycle containers for cloth/textiles.

I like having the 2nd trash can now, if you don't return the recycling program, no biggie.

I feel guilty for not recycling. I believed I was adding to the already polluted earth.

Chesapeake leaders. I already pay taxes and this is something that should be included in my services. I am hoping that this revisit is successful in bringing back the recycling program because we need it. I currently do not recycle, but we should. Noting having curbside pickup is not right.
